Egozoner, in much like fort and condition, if feilureof tyme, or batte of matter, would fuffer me a little to digreffe buto more lower tymes, and to come more nece home, the like cramples I could also inferre of this our countrey of England, concerning the terrible plagues of Bod against the churliff and buthankfull refuling of abuling the benefite of his truth. Hirlt, we read how that Bod fliered by Gildas to preach to the old Britains, and to exhort the unto repentance and amendment of life, and afore to warne the of plagues to come, if they repented not. what anapled it? Gildas was laughed to fcome and taken for a falle prophet. and a malicious preacher, the Britains with lufty courages, wholily faces, and unrepentant hartes, went forth to finne, and to offend the Lord their Bod. what followed ? Bod fent in their enemies on enery lide, & bestroicd them, and gave the land to other nations. Pot many peres pall, Bod feing too larry, superlition, bipocraic, and wicked liming vied in this Ecaime, rayled up that godly learned man John Wickliffe, to preach buto our fathers repentance, and to exhort them to amend their lines, to forlake their Papility & Foolarry, their hypocrify imperatition, and to walke in the feare of Bod. Dis exhogrations were not regarded. De with his Sermons was despited. Dis bookes and he himfelf after his death were burnt, what followed? they flue their right king, and fet op three wrong kings on a rowe, under whom all the noble bloud was flaine up, & halfe the commons thereto, what in Fraunce, & with their ownsword in fighting among themselics for the crowne. and the Lities and townes decayed, and the land brouche halfe to a wildernes, in respect of that it was before. O cr treme plagues of Bods vengeance. Since that tynic even of late yeares, Bod once againe bauing pitie of this realin of Andland, railed by his prophets, namely, William Tindall, Thomas Bilney, John Frith, Doctor Barttes, Ierome Garret, Anthonie Person, with divers other, which both with their wittings and sermons earnestly laboured to call vs buto repentaunce, that by this meanes the fierce weath of Bod might be turned away from bs. But how were they in= treated? how were their painfull labours regarded? they themselves were condemned and burnt as beretikes, and their bokes condemned and burnt as heretical. The time thall come faith Christ, that whosoever killeth you, will thinke that he both Bod hie good service, whether any thing fince that tyme bath to chaunced this Realine wor thy the name of a plague, let the godly wife indge. If Bod hath deferred his punishment, of toggene vs there our wicbed beedes, as I wuft he hath, let vs not therfore be proud and hie minded, but most humbly thanke him for his tender increies, and beware of the like bugodly enterpifes hereafter. Reither is it here any neede to speake of these our lower and latter tymes, which have ben in king Henry and king Edwards dayes, leeing the memory thereof is yet fresh, and cannot be forgotten. But let this faile, of this I am fure, that Bod yet once againe is come on vilitation to this thurch of England, yea and that more louintly a be= neficially then ever be bid afore. For in this his vilitation be hath reducted many abutes, and cleaned his church of much bugodines and superfittion, and made it a glosious Church, if it be compared to the oldeforme and flace. And now how gratefull receivers we be, with what hart, fludy and reacreace we embrace that which he hath given, that I referre either to the that see our fruits, or to the sequele, which peraducutive will declare. But this by the way of digression. Pow to regresse agains to the state of the first former tymes. It remaineth, that as I have set fouth the iultice of Bod opon these Romain persecutors: so now we declare their perfecutions railed by against the people and fernauntes of Chrift, within the space of 300, yeares after Chailf. which perfecutions in number commonly are collted to be tenne, belides the perfecutions first moned by the Jewes in Dierusalem and other places against the Apo= files. In the which, first S. Steuen the Deacon was put to death, with divers other moe, in the laine race of tyme either flaine, or cast into prilo. At the doing wherof, Saule the same tyme playd the doughtic Pharise, beyng not yet conected to the fayth of Chill, wherofthe hillory is playne in the Actes of the Apolities let forth at large by S. Luke.

After the Marry dome of this bleffed Steuen, fuffered next James the holy Apolitic of Christ, and brother of John. Of which James, mention is made in the Actes of the Apolles the rij. chap. where is declared, how that not long after the floring of Stephen, king Berode firetched forth his hand, to take and afflict certaine of the cogres gation: among whome James was one, whom he fiew with the fword, ac. Of this James, Eusebius also inferreth mention, alleaging Clement, thus writing a memorable flory of him. Thus James (faith Clement) when hee was brought to the tribunaliseat, he that brought him (& was the cause of his trouble) seeing him to be condemned, and that he Mould luffer death : as he went to the execution, he being moued therewith in hart and confesione, confesion himselfe also of his owne accord to be a Christian. And so were they both led footh together, where in the way he delived of James to forgine him that he had done . After that James had a little pauled with him vpon the matter, turning to him Peace (fayth he) be to thee brother, and killed him, and both were beheaded together, an. 36.

Dorotheus in his bothe named Synopsis restisseth, that after a mar-Nicanor one of the vij. Deacons, with 2000, other, which beleued in Chailt, luffred also the same day, when as Ste uen did fuffer

The fairs Dorotheus witnesseth also of Simon, att other Nicanor of the Deacons, Bilhop afterward of Bostram in Arabic, there to be burned. Parmenias allo an other of the Deacons

Thomas preached to the Parthiaus, Wedes, and perfians: Allo to the Bermains, Diraconis, Bactris, & Magis. De luffred in Calamina a Citie of Judea, being flaine with a dart.

Simon Zelotes preached at Manritania, and in the Countrey of Afrike. And in Butania hee was lykewife

Andas wother of James, called also Thaddeus, and Leveus, preached to the Edelleus, and to all McCopotamia. He was layne buden Augarus, king of the Edelleus in Berito.

Simon called Cananeus, which was brother to Jude about mentioned, and to James the younger, which all were the formes of Mary Cleopin, and of Aipheus, was Bilhop of Dicrulalem after James, and was eructiced in flayne. a Litte of Egypt in the tyme of Traianus Emperour, as Dorotheus recoideth. But Abdias witteth, thathee with his brother Jude, were both flayne by a timult of the people in Suany a citie of Parlidis.

Marke the Buangelift, and first Bilhop of Alexandria, preached the Bolpell in Egypt, and there drawen with topes buto the fire, was burned, and afterward buried in a place called there Bucolus, under the ratgue of Traianus Einverour.

Bartholomeus is layo allo to preach to the Indians, and to have converted the Gospell of S. Wather into their tonge, where he continued a great space doing many miracies. At laft in Albania a citie of greater Armenia, after and beheadinces perfecutions, he was beaten doune with flanes, then crucified, and after being excoriate, he was at length

beheaded, Ioan. De Monte Regali Of Andrew the Apostle and brother to peter, thus wriwith Ierome in his booke De catalogo scriptorum Eccles. An= drew the brother of peter (in the tyme and raigne of Vespasianus, as our aunceters have reported) did preach in the 80. years of our Lord Jesu Christ to the Scithians, Sogdians to the Sarous, and in a Citie which is called Augustia, where the Ethiopians do now inhabite. We was burich in Patris a citic of Achaia, being crucified of Egeas the gouernour of the Edellians : hitherto writeth Ierome-Although in the number of yeares beseineth a little to mille, for Vespasianus reached not to the yere so. after Chill. But Bernard in his lecond Sermon, and S. Cyprian in his booke De duplici Martyrio, doe make mention of the confession and Martyrdome of this blelled Apolite; wherefpartly out of thele, partly out of other credible writers we have collected after this maner: that when as Andrew being conner= fant in a Citie of Achaia called Patris, through his diffigent preaching had brought many to the faith of Christ: Egeas the governour knowing this, reloxted thither to the intet he might constraine as many as did beleeve Chill to bee 130d, by the whole consent of the Senate, to doe factifice but the Jools, and so gene divine house, and them. Ans dien the special country of the beginning to relift the wicked countaile, and the doings of Egeas, went but him, laying in this effect buto him: that it behoused him which was Judge of men, first to know his Judge which dwelleth in heaven, and then to worthip him being knowen; and to in worthipping the true Bod, to renoke his mynd from falle Bods and blynd Idols. Thele wordes spake Andrew to

the Conful. But he greatly therwith discontented, demanuded of him whether he was the same Andrew that did ouerthrow the Temple of \$\tilde{r}\$ gods, and perswaded men of that super-stricious sect, which the Romaines of late had commainded to be abolithed and rejected? Andrew did plainely affirme that the Princes of the Romains did not buderstand the truth, & that the some of Bod comming from heaven
