ments he littlered for it was all drawne together and most pinially wounded and froarched, to that it had ther with loft the proper frame of a man, in whose fuffering Chill obtained inspeakeable glozy, for that he oucreame ois ad= uerlary, and to the instruction of other declared, that no= thingels is terrible, or ought to be feared where the loue of Bod is; nornothing greenous, wherein the glory of Chieft is manuclied.

And when thole wicked men, beganafter a certayne time againe to torment the Martyr, & hoped well to bring it to palle, that either they thould ouercome him in cauling him to recant, by renerating his townents, now whehis body was to fore & fwollen, that he might not fuffer a man to touch him with his hande, or els that if hee died under their handes, yet that thereby they thould firthe fuch feare with the harts of the refl, to cause them to demy Chill. But they were not only disappointed herein, but also contrary to the expectation of men, his bodye was in the latter pu nilliment & topments loupled & reffored, and toke the fyrit Chape and vie of the numbers of the fame, to that the fame his fecond toxment was by the grate of Christ in sceen of

Allo Sathan now thinking to have fetteled himfelfc in the hart of one Byblides, being one of them which had denied Chaift, and thinking to have caused her, beynga weake and feable woman in faith, to haue damned her foule, in bialphenning the name of Bod, brought her to the place of crecution: inforcing to wrest some wicked thing out of the mouth of the Chailtians. But the in midle of her toments, returning to her felfe, and waked as it were out ofher dead slepe, by that temporall paine, called to her re= membraunce the paynes of hell fire, and against all mens expectations remied the townentors, laying. How flouid we Chillians cate young infants (as ye reported of vs) for whom it is not lawfull to eate the bloud of any beaft? Upon that so some as the had consessed her selie to bee a Christian, the was Martyred with the rest. Thus when Abill had ended thole tyrannicall tomments, by the patience fufferaunce of our Saintes, the divellyet invented other engenes and instruments. For when the Christians were call into pillon, they were thut bp in darke and ougly dongeous, and were drawne by the feete, in a racke or ingine made for that purpose, euch but othe lift hole. And many other fuch punishmentes suffered they which the furious ministers stirred by with dendish surve, are wont to put men unto: lo that very manye of them were Arangled & killed in the pillons, whom the Loide in thys maner would have to enion everlatting life, & let forth his And surely these good men were so pittisuily tozmented, that and if they had had all the helpe, a medicines in the world, it was thought impossible for them to lyne, & to be reflored. And thus they remaining in pallon delitture of al humaine belpe, were to trengthened of the Lord, and both in body and minde confirmed, that they comforted & firred up the myndes of the rest, the yonger sorte of them. whiche were latter appuchended, a put in pilon, whole bodies had not yet felt y lath of ywhip, were not able to in dure y tharpness of their imprisonment, but died of y fame.

The bleffed Photinus, who was Deacon to the biffion of Lyons, about. 90. yeares old, and a very feebie of weake man, a could fearfely draw breath for the unbecilitie of his body: yet was he of a linely contage & spirit. For the great believe had of marryzdome, when he was brought unto the indgement leate: although his bodge was feeble and weake, both because of his old age, and also through sicknes, yet was his foule or life preferred to this purpole, that by the same Christ might triumph & be glorified. De, being by the foundiers brought to the place of indigement, many Litizens & men of great ability following him, and the whole multitude cried boon him directly, as though be has beene Chill hunlelfe, gaue a good tellimony. For being demanuded of the chiefe ruler, what was the Chief Mian mans Bod, he auniwered: If thou be worthy to know thou thait know. De being with these words some= what neere touched, caused him to be very soze beaten. For those that stood next him, did him all the spit & displeasure of they could both with hand and force, having no regarde at all to his olde age or white heares. And they which were further of, what focuer came next to hande, they threwe at him, & eucry man thought y he did very wickedly reframe that withheld his hande from not doing the like. For by this meanes they thought that they did revenge the quarell of their Bods. Photinus, now euen as it were galping after life, was throwen into prilon, and within two daies after dued

And here is the mighty providence of 130d, and the inspeakable mercy of Actus Chill declared, which provide

dence being affired amongelt afraternity, is neuer beilde tute of the aide of Irius Chilk. How those which in they? first perfecution denied Chieft, they also were put in pryion, and made pertakers of the others affliction. Petther per oid it any which as all as that time helps them that had benied Chill, but they which confessed him, were imprifoned as chilitians, neither was there any other crime ou iccted against them, but the other fort taken like homicioes and wicked doms, were layd hand on, and had bous ble more punishment then the others had. There me were refreshed with the toy of marryidome, the hope of Boos promises, the love toward Christ, and the spirite of Bod: The other their confciences accused them, Ethat very loze mio much that by their gate, their countenances bewrated buto the rest their giltie coniciences. For the Christians wentforth having cheerefull countenaunces, very much adourned with giozy and grace, infomuch that the very c bondes wherewith they were eyed, let them out as men in feemely apparel: and like as brides when they be decked in gorgeous and gay garments, and therewith al law co as of the redolent lineil of Chaif, so that it might be supposed them to be announced with some sweete baime: whereas the other were doubtfuil and fad, abicct, ilianozed, fulco, to al Chaine, and furthermore remited of the Bentils themsels ues, as weetches, degenerate, having the crime of homicid and defittite of the most precious, glosious, and lively catling of the Chailtian name. And truly by these lighter the reit were confirmed, a being apprehended, confessing chait withoutany flackering, not having so much as y thought of any such benefith mund of denial. And in the same Epittle of the lorefayd bre thren of Fraunce, writing to the brethren of Afia, it followeth in this maner : After their things done, the Martirdome of these holy Saunts were denived dinertly. into divers kindes and formes, as the offering to 180d the Father a garland decked with dincrs and fundry kinds sf colours and houres. For it to behouse the wor by Chainpions of Bod, after they had fuffered divers kindes of colments, and so winning a triumphaunt victory to obtaine great reward of immortalitie.

Then Maturus Blandina, and Attalus together were becught to the comonications, there in the face of the penple to be cast & denoured of the beatts. And Maturus with Sanctus being brought plecond tune to the leaffoide, fuffe= red againe all kinde of councies, as though hetheric they had luffered nothing at all, year ather as though yaduer large being oftentimes put to the worlt, they as itrulying for the crowne, fuffered agains more from ginges. the rearing of wilde beaffe s, a what thingels focuer the frantike people on every fide cryed for and willed. And about al the restithey brought an gron chapte, in the which their bodies being sce, were so tryed and scouched as on a gridiron fried upon the coales, filled with the favour of the frying all the people that frode by. And yet for all that the tormentours cealed not, but wared more fierce and mad against the, la= boxing to onercome the patience of the Saints. Porwithflanding althis they could not get out of Sanctus mouth a= my other thing but the confession which at the beginning he declared. And thus these holy men, after they had long continued aline in this their most hopvible conflicte, at the length were flaine, being made al that whole day a spectacle with the worlde in place and in itede of the games and lightes, which were woont to be exhibited to the people.

And thus much concerning Maturus and Sanctus. Row concerning Blandina, who being fattened vpon a flake, was call to the ranening beaftes to be denoured which thing was not done without the determinate will of Bodito this ende that while the feemed to hang voon a brought forth croffe (as it were) by the feruentnes of her praier, the much agayne, coloricd the rest of the saints, as beholding vitto her chist, with their bodily eyes, which in that agonic infered for them all, and that al which below in him, and fuffer for the glory of Chill, might be allured to line with him for ence. And when they lawe that no bealt woulde come neare her thus hanging, they toke her downe from the tree, and cast her agains into prion till an other time, that the having prices of many battels, might triumphe over that ought Serpent the denilize that the being a weake and fely wo man, and norregarded, armed with Chaill the innincible conquetour, might incourage her brethien, and by the induring of this barraile might winne a crowne of incozruptible glory.

Mom to Arralus, who being also required and cald for of the people to punithment, already prepared (for his confrience lake) commeth forth to the fight.
