Moreover, toward the pore and needy, his pitty & tendernes was fuch, being norwithstanding of so highe & Princely calling: that opon a time being then Cafter day, be litting with the laide Aidanus at meate and lerued after the maner of kings in filter, there commeth to him one of the fernitures bringing him word, that there was a great multitude of pooze people litting in the frete, which beli= red fome almos of the king. Dee hearing this, commaun= deth not only the meate prepared for his owne table to be caried buto them, but also taking a Silver platter whiche fode befoze him, brake it in peeces and fent it among the: And to relieved his pose subjectes, not onely with y meate of his table, but with his diffes also. Aidanus the Bythop feing this and marueiling therat, taketh him by the hand, willing and praying in this wife. This hand, fayth he, I play Bod may continue and never putrific, what the fo= ries fay more concerning this hand of Ofwald, I ented not to medle farther then limple, true, and due provalitie will beare me out. In those pages and partly by the meanes of the said Oswald Kynigilius king of the westsarous was couerted to Christes faith, especially through the godly labor of Berinus which was fent by Pope Honorius to preach in England, and was then made Bilhop of Dorchefter. To whom Quicelinus brother of Kynigilfus after he had also re= coinco baptilme of the laid Berinus gane to him f layo Li= tie to make there his sea. And as Guydo witheseth the laid Quicelinus gaue after to the Bylhop of winchester, seanen myles compasse of land, to builde there the Bylhops sea, the which was accomplished and finished Kenwalkus hys Df this Berinus Malmelbery, Polychronicon, with dy=

ners other writers do report, athing Araunge and myra= culous which if it be a fable as no doubt it is, I cannot but maruel that fo many authors to constantly agre in repo 2= ting and affirming the same. The matter is this: this Berinus being sent as is said, by Honorius to preach in Englad promiseth him to travell to the bettermost borders therof, and there to preach the Bospell, where the name of Christ was never heard. Thus he letting forward in his fournep palleth through Fraunce, and lo to the featide, where hee found a pallage ready, and the winde ferued lo faire, that he was called byon in such halt, that he had no leysure to remember himlelfe to take all things with him, which hee had to cary. At length as he was on the lea failing and al= most in the middle course of his passage, remembred him= selse of a certaine relique lest behinde him soz hall: which Honorius had given him at his comming out, Malmef beriensis calleth it Corporalia, Historia Iornalensis calleth it Pallulam super quam Corpus Christi consecraret, which wee call a Corporas or fuch a like thing, and what els enclosed with in it I can not tell. Bere Berinns in great lozow coulde not tell what to doe, if he thould have spoken to the Beathen mariners, to turne their course backe againe, they woulde bane mocked him, and it had bin in vaine. Wherfore as y flories write, he vololy freppeth into the Sea, and walkepng onfore back again, taketh whim that which was left behind, & fo returneth to his company againe, having not one thied of his garments wette. Of his miracle, or whe= ther I Choulo cal it a fable rather, let the reader indge therof, as he thinketh, because it is not written in the Scrip= ture we are not bound to beleeue it. But if it were true, it is then thought to be wrought of god not for any holines in the manior in the Corporas, but a speciall gifte for the connection of the heathen, for whole faluation Bod lufter= eth oftmany wonders to be done. This Berinus being re= ceited in the Chip againe with a great admiration of the Maryners, beying therewith connerted and Baptyled: was driven at laft by the weather, to the coast of the west= faros, where Kynigilius and his brother Quicelinus abone mentioned did raigne. which two kinges, the same time by preaching of Berinus were converted, and made Chitstenmen, with the people of the country, being before rude and barbarous. It happened the same time when the for= faid kings thoulde bee chriftened, that Ofwaldus (mentio= ned a little before)king of Porthumberland, was the prefent, and the fame day marted Kynigilius his daughter, and allo was godfather to the king.

Thus Ofwald after he had reigned ir. yeares in fuch holines and perfectnes of life, as is about fpecified, was Nayne at length in the field called Marfield, by wicked Peda, king of the egercians, which Penda, at length after all his trianny was ourcome and flame by Ofwy brother to Ofwald, nert king after Ofwald of Morthumberland, not-withstanding he had thirte y people which Ofwy had: this Penda being a panim had iff. lonnes Wolferus, Weda, and Egfridus. To this seconde sonne Weda, Oswy had before

time maried his danghter, by content of Penda hys father. The whiche Weda by helpe of Olivy was made Kyng of Southmercia, the which Lord thip is fenered from north= mercia by the rener of Trent. The same Weda morconer, at what time he maried the daughter of Ofwy, promifed to him that he would become a chailten man, which thing he performed after the beath of Penda his Father, but after= ward within iii. yeares of his reigne, he was by realon of his wife flaine: And after him the kingdome fell to Wolferus the other brother, who beyng wedded to Ermenilda, daughter of Ercomber kying of Bente, was shortlye after Chailtened, to that he is accounted the first chaistened king of Mercia. This Wolferus conquered Kenwalcus Thyng of Rent, and gat y Hie of wight, which after he gave to Sigbertking of Theakangles, vpon condition he would be Childened. And thus the Ballangles, which before had expirited Mellius there bilhop, as is declared recovered as gaine the Christian faith buder Sigbert their King, who by the meanes of the forelayd Wolferus was reduced and

Baptifed by Financis the Bylhop. But to returne agains to Olwy, from whom we have a little digreffed, of whom we flewed before how he fuce= bed after Oswald in the province of Bernicia, to whom al= so was ionned Oswynus hys cosin, oner the Pronince of Devia, and therwith his felow, Ofwy, raigned the space of bij. Percethis Ofwyne was gentle, & liberal to his people and no leffe denout towarde Bod: who upon a time had given to Aidanus the bilion above mentioned, a Princely Boile with the trappers, & all that appertained therro: be= cause he Chould not so much tranel on footebut some tyme case himselfe withall. Thus Adams the Scottishe By= Shop as he was riving upon his kingly house, by the way meteth him a certaine pope man alking and crauing bys charitie. Aidanus hauing nothing els to gine him: lighted down, and grueth to him his hogle trapped and garnillied as he was. The King understanding this, anot contented therwith, as he was entring to dinner with the layd Aidanus what ment you father Byffion, (layd he) to give away my horfe I gave you, onto the begger? Had not I other horfes in my fable that might have served him well inough, but you must give awaye that which of purpose was pickt out for you among the chiefest? To whome the Bilhop made auniwere againe faying or rather rebuking the king, what be these wordes (D king saide he) that you speaket why set you more price by an horse, which is but the fole of an horse, then you do by him which is the some of Mary, yea which is the founc of Bod? Be faid but thys when the king forthwith bugirding his sword fed about him (as he was then newly come in from hunting) falleth downe at the feete of the 13 thop, desiring him to forgine him that, and he would never after speake word to him, for any treature he thould afterward give away of his. The Bilhop leing the king to mekely affected, hee then takyng him by, a chering him againe with words, began thoutly after to weepe & to be very beaut, his minister asking the caufe therof, Aidanus aunswered in his scottist language faying to him: I weepe faith he for that this king cannot line log. This people is not worthy to have such a Prince as he is to raigne among them. And lo as Aidanus layd, it came to palle. For not long after Olwy the king of Berni= cia difonining at him, when Ofwyne either being not able or not willing to loyne with him in Battaile, caused hym traiteroully to be liame. And so Oswy, with his some Egfride raigned in Rozthumberland alone.

In the time eallo in the house, of this Oswy king of Porthuberland, was a certaine man named Benedict, who was the bringer op of Bedefrom his youth, a toke hun to his institution, whe he was but seven yere old, a so taught him during his life. This Benedict, on Benet, delicending of a noble flocke and rich kinne & in good fanour with Office forfoke fernice, house, and at his kindred to lerue Chaff, & wet to Rome (where he had bene in his life time v.times) and brought from thence bokes, into Wonasteries, with other things which he thought then to serue for denotion. Thys Bennedick surnamed Byshop, was the fyist that brought in the arte and vie of glaling into this lande. For before that, glasse windowes were not knowen, either in

churches, or in houses.

In the raigne of the forelaid Ofwye and Egfride hys sonne, was Botulphus Abbot : which builded in the East part of Lincolne an Abbey. Also Aidanus, Finianus, & Colmannus, with iif. Scottith Bilhops of Morthumberlande holy men, held with PBritaines, against the Romish order forthe keeping of Bafter daye. Mozeoner Cutbertus Iarumannus, Cedda, and Wilfridus lined the same time, who as I judge to be Bylhops of an holy connectation, fo I thought it lufficient here only to name them. As touching
