Walter Brute.

Whether the doctrine of Brute was cuer against resi-stance, howe is this lyke to be true.

Citie of Hereford, to Thomas Oldcaftle, Rich. Nash, Roger Wygmore, Thomas Wavlwayne, Iohn Skydmore, Iohn VpHarry, Henry Motton, and to the Shiriffe of Hereford, sendeth salutations.

For asmuche as it is advertised vs, that one Walter Brute; and other fuch children of iniquitie, have damnably holden, affirmed, and preached, certaine articles and conclusions being notorioufly repugnaunt against the holy Scripture (of the which, some of them as herefies, and the rest as errours, are finally by the Church condemned) and that in divers places within the dioces of Hereford and partes neare adioyning, both princly, openly, and obitinately: which thing wee perceive not onely to redounde to the subuersion(in a maner) of the Catholicke faith, which as well we, as other catholicke Princes ought of duety to maintaine, but also to forewarne vs of the subuersion of our faithfull Diocesans. And that the fayd Bishop, upon the good deliberation and aduisement of a great number of Doctours in Divinitie, and other learned & skilfull men in the Scriptures, of speciall denotion, according to his bounden duetie, purposed to begin and make divers and sundry processes by law to be sent unto the foresayd Walter and hys accomplices, to appere personally before him and other the Do-Ctours aforefaid, in the cathedrall church of Hereford, the morow after the translation of S. Thomas of Hereforde next ensuing, and to procede in the same place against the same Walter, in the forefaide articles and conclusions, for the amendement of his soule. Now a fresh (because that the sayd Walter and others of their retinue, cleaning and confederating with him, might not fuffer condigne paines according to their demerites) indeuour themselues to make voide and fruit rate the fayde godly purpose of the same Bishop, in such correction & execution as should have bene done: and with force doe refift and let the same with all the power they may, to the great contempt of vs and of our crowne, and to the breaking and hurring of our peace, and pernicious example of others: Doe appoynt you and euery of you, immediatly as foone as this our commission shall be deliuered vnto you, in our behalfe and name, to make open proclamation in the diocesse and partes aforesayde, where ye shall thinke it most meete and convenient? That no man be so hardy hencefoorth, of what state or condition socuer he shall be, within the Dioces and partes aforesayde, vport paine of forfaiture of all that ever hee hath, to make or leanie any conuenticles, affemblies, or confederacies, by any colour: or that they presume to attempt or procure any other thing, wherby our peace may be hurt or broken, or that the same Bishops and Do-ctors aforesaid, may be by any meanes molested or let in the execution of suche correction as is to be done, according to the Canonical fanctions, and to arest all those which ye shal stade or take offending in this behalfe, or that keepe themielues in any fuche conuenticles. And that they being committed to prison, be there kept, till you shall haue other commaundement from vs and our counsel for their deliueraunce: And that ye distinctly and plainly certifie vs and our fayd counfell, of all your doing in thys behalfe under your seales, or else the seales of some of you. And therefore we itraightly charge and commaunde you, and every of you that ye diligently attende vpon the premises, and that in your deedes yee execute the same with all diligence and carefull indeuour, in the forme and maner aforesaide. And further, wee geue straight charge and commaundement to all and fingular Shriffes, Maiors, Builiffes, Constables, and other our faithfull subjectes, by the tenour of these presents: that they be attending vpon you, counselling and aiding you and enery of you, as is meete and connenient in the doing and execution of the premities. In witnesse whereof, we have caused these our letters patents to be made. Witnesse my felie at Wellminster, the 22 day of September, in the 17 yeare of our raigne:

¶By the fame King and Counfell.

Thus king Richard by the letting on of w. Courtney Archb. of Canterb. and his fellowes, taking part wyth the Pope, and Romith Pictares: wared fomeroing frait and harde to the poic Chailtians of the contrary live of myckleffe, as by their letters about prefixed may appeare. Ali= beir, buring all the life of the laide king, I finde of none cr= pielly by name that luffered burning. Porwythflanding, fome there were which by the forelaide Archbilly, william Courtney, and other Bilhops, had bene condemned and diners also abured, and did penance as well in other places, as chiefly about the towns of Leycetter as followers here to be declared, out of the Archbythoppes register and recordes=

At what time the laide Archbilhop w. Courtney was in his vilitation at the towns of Lexiciter, certaine there were accused and detected to him, by the monks and other Priestes in the layd towne. The names of which persons there detected, were one Roger Detter, Aicholas Taylor Richard wagflaffe, Michael Scrinener, william Smith, John Benry, wil. Barchmeanar, and Roger Boldfmith, inhabitances of the same towne of Leycester: These with other moc, were denounced to the Archbythop for holding

the opinion of the Sacrament of the aulture, of auriculate confellion, and other Sacraments, contrarp to that which the Church of Rome both preach and observer All whych parties about named, & many other mo whole names are not knowen, did hold these herelies and errors here under wystren, and are of the Momily church condemued.

1. That in the Sacrament of the aultar, after the words of confecuation, there remainesh the body of Chant with the materiall bread.

2. That images ought not to be worthipped in any cale, northat no man ought to let any candles before them. 3. That no croffe ought to be worthipped.

That Malles, and Mattens, ought not with an high and loud voice to be layd in the Church.

s. Item, that no Curace of Pueft taken in any crine can confectate, heare confessions, not minister any of the Sacramenes of the church.

6. That the Pope and all piclates of the Churche, can not binde any man to the fentaice of excommunication, bules they know him to be first excommunicated of Bod

That no Piclate of the church, can grade any pardons. 8. Egat enery lay manmay in enery place, preach & teach the Bospell.

9. That it is finne to gene any almos of charitie, to the fris ers preachers, Comornes, Augustines, or Carmelites.
10. That no oblation ought to be vied at the funeralles of the bead.

ii. That it is not necessary to make consession of ours sinnes to the priest.

12. That every good man although hee be volcarned, is a Prieft.

These Articles they taught, preathed, & affirmed ma- Roger, Nichonifestly in the towns of Leceiter & other places adjoyning: las Richard, wherupon, the laide Archb. monished the laide Roger, and Micholas withe rest, on the next day to make answer buto bun in the layo monaffery to the forelayd articles. But the forelaide Roger and Micholas with the reft, his thesclues out of the way, and appeared not, whereupon, the Archb. bpon All hallow day, being the i. day of Roueinber, celebrating the high malle at the bigh aulter in the layd monaferic, being attired in hys Pontificalibus : Denounced the faide parties with all their adherents, fautors, fauourers, and counfellers, ercommunicate and accurled, whych cy ther beloe, taught, or maintained the forelaide conclutions heretical & erroneous, and that in folemn wife, by ringing the bels, lighting the candels, and putting out the fame as gaine, and throwing them downe to the grounde wother circumftances thereimto belonging. Thon the motow als ter(being all Soulne day) he lent for al the curates & other lay men of the towne of Leiceller, to inquire more diligetly of the verity of luch matter as they knewe, & were able to lay against any persons whatsoener, concerning p soze fayd articles, as allo against the parties before named and specified upon their othes: denouncing energone of them, fenerally by their names to be excomunicated and accurfed, a caused them also in divers parish churches in Leice= fter, also to be excommunicate. And further the said Archb. interdicted the whole Towns of Lexecter, Eall the churthes in the faint, so long as any of the foresayde excominu= nicate persons thous remaine of be wythinthe same, and till that all the ioliardes of the towne, thould return and amend from fuch herefics & errogs, obtaining at the layde Archb. hys handes the benefite of absolution.

At length it was declared & thewed to the fayd Archb. that there was a certam anchozelle whole name was Ma= tilde, inclosed wythin the Churchyard of S. Weters church of the layd towne of Leycester, to be insected (as they sayd) with the pelliferous contagion of the forefait heretikes & foliardes: wherupon, after that the layd Archb. had cramined the foreland Matilde, touching the forelande conclusions, becelies, and errours, and founde bernot to answere plainly and directly to the fame, but fophistically and fubtelly : gaue and alligned onto her a day peremptonie, perfonally to appeare before bym in the Monasteric of C. Jas mes at Morthampton, morefully to auniwer to the layde articles, herelies, and arrours, which was the 6, day of the layd moneth of Pouember: commanding the abbot of the monasterie of paris aforelayd, that the done of the recluse in which the layd Matild was, thould be opened, and that til his returne he thuid caufe her to be put in fafe cuftoby. That done, he lent forth his mandate, against the lolardes

bnder this forme.
