Aicharde by the grace of Bod, king of England and of Fraunce. &c. wee on the behalfe of our holy mother the Church, by the kingsauthoritic aforefaid, do require you that you cause the same ini= chard, william, langer, and the reft, to be arefled, and fent buto be, that they rough their pernicious doctrine doe not infect the people of Bod. ac. Benen under our feale ac.

Margaret Caily a Nun constrained agayust her will to take aaine her habite.

By an other instrumentallo in the same Register, is mention made of one Margaret Laily Ponne, whych for: faking her order, was by the fayde Archb. confragued as gainft her wil, agains to enter the fame, as by then milrus ment here buder infuing may appeare. 21 26 63

Cwilliam by the grace of Bod. ac. To our reverand bros ther in God, John by the grace of God, Bylhop of Bly greting. ac. In the vilitation of our dioces of Lincolne according to our office, amogst other enormities worthy reformation, we found, one thepe out of our fold frayed and amongeli the briers tangled, to witte, Margarete Caily, Munne profelled, of the monafterie of S. Rabegonde win your Diocelle: who calling the habite of her Relygion, was founde in fecular active, many yeares being an Apoflata, eleading a diffolute life. And leaft her bloud fouide be required at our hands, we have caused her to be taken, and brought buto you being her pastoriand straitly intoy= ning you by thele prefents so commaund, that you admit the fame Margarete againe into her foreland Monafterie (although returned against her wil) or els into some other place, where for her foules health you thall thincke mothe connenient: and that from henceforth the be lafely kept, as in the straight examination of the same you wil yeld an accompt. Beuen under our leale. &c.

Matild recateth.

By fundry other instrumentes also in the same register recorded I finde, that the forelaide Matilde the anchorelle, bpon the ftraight cramination and handeling of the forefaid Archbilhop, befoze whome peremptority the was entoyned to appeare, and till that day of apparance taken out of the recluie and committed to late cultodie as you heard: retracted and recanted her forelayd articles and opinions. For the which the being enioyned 40. dayes penance, was againe admitted into her fozelaid rectule in Leycester. The Bythops letter to the Magilirates of the townethus beginneth. Willielmus permissione diuina. &c. dilectis filijs. &c.

William Smith Roger Dexter, & Alice his wife abiure.

Also, by an other letter of the forelayde Archbilly to the Deane of the Cathedrall church of our Ladge of Leycester being regiltred, I finde; that of the number of thole 8. perfons before recited, whom the Archbilhop himselfe at high Walle, oid in bys Pontificalibus to folemnely curle with booke, bell, and candle: After certeine proces being lent out against them, or els in the meane time being apprehended & taken:two of them recanted their opinions, to wit, william Smith and Roger Derter. But in the meane tyme Alyce the wife of the layde Roger Derter, takyng holde of the foresaid articles with her husband also, together with the said william Smith, abinico the same. For these be the wordes of the instrument, Subsequenter vero, præfati Wilielmus, Rogerus, & Alicia reatus suos respicientes, se nostro conspectui præsentarunt.&c. Potwythstanding, whether they presented these willingly, or els were brought against their wils (as most like it was) hard penance was entoyned them before they were absolued. These be the wordes of the instrument.

Sancta mater ecclesia &c. i. Seeing our holy mother the church, denieth not her lap to any peniter childe returning to the unitie of her, but rather profereth to them the fame : we therefore do receive agains the layd william, Roger, & Alice to grace. And further have caused them to abiure all and lingular the aforelaide articles & opinions before they received of vs the benefit of absolution, were lwsed from the lentence of excomunication wherin they were inarled: iniopning buto them penance, according to the quantitie of the crime, in forme as followeth, that is to fay. That eues ry one of them p sonday next after their returning to they proper godes: they the sayd william, Roger, & Alice, holding energy one an image of p crucifix in their right hands, and in their left handes energy one of them a taper of waxe, waying half a pound waight, in their shirts (having none of the analysis) and the control of the says of other apparel uppon them) doe goe before the Croffe three times, during the procession of the Cathedrall Churche of our Lady of Lecctier: that is to lay, in the beginning of the procession, in the middle of the procession, and in the latter end of the procession: to the honor of hym that was crucified in the memoriall of his pallion, and to the honor of the virgin his mother: who also denoutly bowing their knees

and kneeling, thall kille the fame crucifice to belde in theve handes. And so with the same procession, they entring a= gaine into the church: (hall fland during all the time of the holy Matte, before the image of the Croffe with their Ta= pers and croffes in their handes. And when the Malle is ended, the layde william, Roger, & Alice, thall offer to him that celebrated that day the Made. Then vpon the Sater= day nert insuing: the layd william, Roger, and Alice, that in the full and publique market, within the towns of Lci= ceffer, fande in like manner in their fhirtes, without any more clothes open their bodies, holding the forelayd croffes in their right hads, which croffes, three times they that (buring the market) ocuoutly kille renevently kneelyng bupon their knees: that is, in the beginning of the market, in the middle of the market, and in the ende of the market. And the fayde william (for that hee somewhat understan= deth the Latine tounge) Chall lay this Antheance with the collect Sancta Katharina: and the forelayde Roger and Alice, being bulearned, thall fay benoutly a Pater nofter, and an Aug Maria. And thirdly, the Sonday next immediatly after the fame, the layde william, Roger, and Alice, in they pas rill Church of the layd towns of Leicelter, Chall stand and do as uppon the Sonday before, they stode and dyd in the cathedrall Church of our Ladie aforelayde, in all thynges. which done, the forelayd william, Roger, and Alice, after Malle, thall offer to the Priest or chaptains that celebrated the same, with all humilitiand reucrence the ware tapers, which they chall carre in their handes. And because of the colde weather y now is, least the foresaid penitents myght peraduenture take some bodely hurt flanding so long na-ked (being mindful to moderate partly the sayd our rigoz) we gene leane: That after their entrance into the churches about layde, whilest they shall be in hearing the logelayde ther gracimalles: that they may put on necellary garments to keepe them from cold, lo that their heads and fecte notwithflan= dered. ding, be bare and bucouered. wee therefore will and com= maund you together and a part, that you denounce the faid poilism, Roger, and Alice, to be absolued and reflored as gaine to the pricte of our holy mother the church, and that You call them forth to do their penance in maner and forme aforelayde. Buen at Dorcheller, the 17, day of Aducinber in the yeare of our Lorde Bod 1389, and the 9, yeare of our translation.

Unto the nacration of these about layd, we wil adioune the frozy of one Peter Patelhulan Auften Frier, who obtaining by the Popes printledge (through the meanes of Walter Dis, confesiour to the Duke of Lancaster) libertie to chaunge his coat and religion, and hearing the doctrine of John wicklelle & other of the fame fort: began at length to preach opely and to detect the vices of his order, in luch forte as all men wondered to heare the hourible recyting thereof. This being brought to the eares of hys order, they to the number of 12. (coming out of their house to the place where he was preaching) thought to have with flode hym perforce. Among whome one especially for the zeale of hys religion, stode by openly in his preaching, and contraried y which he laid, who then was preaching in the Church of S. Christopher in London. This when the faithfull Lon= doners did see, taking griefe hereat, were moued w great ire against the saide Frier, thusting tim with his other beethen out of the church, whome they not onely had beaten and fore wouded, but also followed them home to their house, mineding to have destroicd their mansion wfire al= fo, and so would have done, had not one of the sheristes of London, with two of the Friers of the saybe house well knowen a reported amongst the Londoners, with gentle wordes mittigated theirrage and violence. After thys, Joe Peter Pateter patelhull thus diffurbed as is aforelayd, was defired fhull. by the Londiners (for fo much as he could not well preach amongest them) to put in writing that, which he had sayde before, and other things more that he knew by the friers: who then at their request wayting the same, accused the fris ers of murther, comitted against divers of their brethren. And to make the matter more apparant & credible, he de= clared the names of them that were murthered, with the names also of their tormentours. And named moreover, time and place where and when they were murthered, and ble crimes, where they were buryed. Bee affirmed further, that they were Sodomites and traitours both to the kying and the realine with many other crimes, which mine authour for tediousnes, leaveth ofto recite. And for the more confutati= on of the faid friers, the Londiners caused the sayd Bill, to be openly set up at S. Paules Churche doze in London, which was there red and copied out of very many. Thys was done in the yeare of our Lord 1387, and in the 10, year 2 1387.
