beld the fame. Then finally, it was demaunded of the faid fir william, why he ought not to be pronounced as a man fallen into herelic, and further to proceede unto his dearadation, according to the canonical functions: whereinto he answered nothing, neither could be alledge any cause to

whernepon, the forelayd Archb. of Cant. by the counfaile and confent of the whole councel, and especially by the countail and allent of the renered fathers and Bilhops, as allo, 19 riours, Deanes, Archdeacons, and other worthips full Doctours and Clerkes then and there present in the councel: Fully determined to proceede to the degradation, and actuall depoling of the layde william Saucre, as refallen into herely, and as incorrigible, according to the fentence definitive put in wayting, the tenoure whereof is in wordes as followeth.

Sentenca of relapse.

In the name of God Amen: Wee Thomas by the grace of God Archb.of Cant. Legate of the sea Apostolicall and Metropolitane of all England : doe finde and declare, that thou William Sawtrie, otherwise called Chatris Priest, by vs with the counsaile & assent of all and fingular our felowe brethren and whole Clergy, by this our sentence diffinitiue declared in wryting, hast bene for heresie conuict and condemned, and art (being againe fallen into herefy) to be deposed and degraded, by these presents.

And from that day being wedenloay, there was in the fayde councell prominciall nothing further profecuted, but was continued with all dependences, till the Friday next infuing. whych Friday approching, M. Micholas Kift)= ton, by the commandement of the layd Archb. of Canterb. being then bulied as he laid in the Parliament houle: continucd this councel and convocation with al incidents, dependents, and occasions, growing and annexed therunto, to the next day, to wit faterday next and immediatly after influing. Upon Saterday being the 26, of the fayd moneth of February, the foresayde Archbilliop of Canterbury sate in the Bythops feare of the forelayde Church of S. Paule in London, and folentily apparelled in his Pontifical attire, litting to hym as his alliftents thefe renerend fathers and Bishops, of London, Lyncolne, Barsozo, Exeter, Meneuensis & Rossensis Episcopi, about mentioned: commann= bed and caused the sayd six w. Sautry apparelled in prick-ly vestiments, to be brought & appeare before hym. That bone, he declared and expounded in English to al the elecgy and people there, in a great multitude allembled: that al processe was finished and ended against the said syr william Sautry. whych thing finished, before the pronouncing of the layd lentence of the Belaple against the layd sie william as is premiled, he often then and there recited a read. And for that he sawe the sayde william in that behalfe, no= thing abathed: De proceded to his degradation and actuall depolition in forme as folowerh.

Alfo, wee Thomas, Archb, afozefayd, by connfaile, affent and authority whych wee have over thee the forelayde william, an Accolite piecented, wearing the habite of an Accolice, and heretike, twife fallen, by our fentence as is a= forelaid condemned: do degrade and put from thee al order of an Accolite: And in ligne and toke of thys thy degrada= tion, and actuall deposition, we take from thee the candle= fiche and taper, and also vrceolum, and doe depute thee of from hym.

all and all maner dignity of an Accolite.
Also, we Thomas, Archb. afozesayd by assent, counsel, and authority whych uppon thee the foreland william we haue, an Exozcift pretented, in the habite of an Exozcift oz holy water clarke, being an hereticke, twite fallen, and by our sentence as is aforesayd condemned, we doe degrade & depole thee from the order of an Exorcift; and in token of thys thy degradation and actuall depolition, we take from the boke of conjurations, and doe deprine thee of all and lingular dignity of an Exozcist.

Allo, we Thomas Archbilh, aforelayd, by affent, coun= faile, and authority, as is about fayd, doe degrade & depose thee the foresayde william, reader pretented, clothed in the habit of a reader, an hereticke, twife tallen, and by our fentence as is aforelayd, condened: from the order of a reader. And in token of this thy degradation and actuall depoliti= on, we take from thee the boke of the deutic lection's (that is the booke of the Church legende) and doe deprine thee of all and lingular maner of dignity of fuch a reader.

Item, we Thomas Archbilhop of Canterbury afoze= fayd, by authority, countaile, and allent, the which we have as is aforclaid, do degrade and put thee the foreland william Sawtre, ferten pretented, in the habite of a ferten, and wearing a furplice, being an hereticke, twife fallen, by our fentence difinitive condemned, as aforclaid: from the order of a Septen. And in token of thys thy degradation and actuall depolition, for the causes aforesayd, we take from thee the keyes of the Church doze, and thy furplice, and doc de= prine thee of all and lingular maner of commodityes of a

doze keeper.

And also, by the authority of omnipotent God the father, the sonne, and holy ghost, and by our authority, counfaile, & affent of our whole councel proninciall about written, we do degrade thee and depole thee being heere personally present before vs. from orders, benefices, privilegies and habite in the church, and so thy pertinacie incorrigible we doe disgrade thee, before the fecular Lourt of the hygh Constable and marthal of England, here being personal ly piclent, and do depole thee from all and lingular clerke= ly honours and dignities whatfoener, by thele waytings. Also in token of thy degradation and deposition, here actually wee have caused thy crowne and ecclesiastical tonsure taken from his in our picture to be rated away, & utterly to be abolished, head, maketh lyke unto the forme of a leculare lay man; and here doe put vp all in all. bponthe head, of thee the forelayd william, the cap of a lay fecular person: beseeching the court aforesaid, that they wil recease favourably the layde william buto them thus recommitted.

Thus william Sawtre the lecuaunt of Chile, being otterly thurst out of the Popes kingdome, and metamoz phosed from a clerke to a secular lay man, was committed (as ye have heard) but o the secular power. Which so done, the Bylhops yet not heerewith contented, ceale not to call ppo the king, to cause him to be brought forth to spedy eres cution. Whereupon the king, ready inough and to much to gratify the cleargy, and to retaine their fanours, directeth out a terrible decree against the said william Sawtre, and fent it to the Maior and Sheriffes of London to be put in execution, the tenour wherof here under emueth.
