Duer this I beleue, that through counfell of this most bleue Drinity, in molt couenient time before ordeined for toe laluation or mankinde, the fecond perfon of this Trini ty, was ordened to take the forme of ma, that is, the kinde orma. And I beleue, that this lecod person our Lord Jesu Doult, was conceined through the holy ghoft, in f wombe of the most blelled virgin Mary, without mans iced . And I beleue, that after 9. monethes Chaift was borne of this most blessed virgine, without any payne or breaking of the closter of her wombe, and without filth of her virginity.

And I beleue, that Chift our Sautour was Circumcifed in the eight day after his birth, in fulfilling of the law, and his name was called Jelus, which was lo called of \$ Angel, before that he was conceived in the wombe of Ma=

ry his mother.

And I beleue, that Christ, as he was about exp. yeare olde, was Bapticed in the floud of Jordane of John Bap= tistiand in the likenes of a Doue the holy Bhost desceded there byon him, a a voyce was heard from heaven, laying: Thou art my welbeloued fonne, in thee Jam full pleafed.

And A velcue, that Chuft, was mouce then by the ho-ly ghoff, for to go into defert, and there he falled 40 dayes & 40. nightes without bodely ineat and drink. And I beleue that by and by after his falting, when the manhood of chill hugred, the fiend came to him, and tempted him in glotto= my, in vayin glory, and in couetife: but in all those temptations, Christ concluded the fiend, and withstood him. And then without tarying. If in began to preach and to fay on-to the people: do ye penaunce, for the Realme of heaven is nom at hand.

I beleue that Chill in all his time here lined most holily, and taught the will of his father most truly; and I be icue that he suffered thertoze, most wzongfully, greatest re-

prices and despilinges.

And after this, when Chill woulde make an end here of this tepozallife, I beleue that in the day next before that be would luffer pallid in the morne: In forme of bread and of wine, he ordeined the Sacrament of his fielh and hos bloud, that is, his owne precious body, & gaue it to his A= postles for to eat: communding them, and by them all their after commers, that they flouid do it in this forme that he the wed to them, vie themselices, and teach and como forth to other men and wome this most worshipfull holyest iacrament, in mindfulnes of his holyest living, & of his most true preaching, a of his widull and patient inffering of the

most paynefull passion.

And I belene, that thys Chiff our Saufour, after that be had ordeined this most worthy Sacrament of his own precious body:he wet forth wilfully agaynft his enemics, and he luffered them most paciently to lay their hands most violently vpo him, and to binde him, and to lead him forth as a theere, to scome him, and buffet him, and all to blow Diffie him with their fpittinges. Duer this, I beleue, that Christ luffered most meetly and paciently his enemies, for to ding out with tharp scourges the bloud y was between his fkinne and his field: yea without grudging Christ fuffered the cruell Jewes to crowne him with most sharpe thomes, and to freike him with a recoe. And after, Chill fuffered wicked Jewes to draw him out vpon the croffe, & for to nayle him thereupon hand and force. And fo through his pitifull nayling, Chaift thed out wilfully for mans life, the blond that was in his vaynes. And then Christ gaus wilfully his spirit into y hads or power of his father, & so, as he would, & whehe would, chill died wilfully for mas Take upon the croffe. And notwithstading that Christ was wilfully, paynefully, a molt thamefully put to death, as to the world: there was left blond and water in his hart as before ordeined, that he would theod out this bloud a this water formas faluation. And therefore he fuffred & Jewes to make a blinde knight to think him into the hart with a speare, and this the blond and water that was in his hart, Chailf would thed out formans loue, And after this, I be leve that Chiff was taken downs from the croffe and buried. And I beleue that on the third day by power of hys Bodhead, Chuft role againe from death to life. And the pl. day therafter, I beleue that Chiff asceded by into heaven and that he there litteth on the right hand of the father al= mighty. And the fifty day after this op going, he fet to hys Apostles the holy gboth, that he had promised them before. And I beleue that Chaift fhall come & judge all mankind, fome to enerlatting peace, and fome to enerlatting paines.

And as I believe in the father & in the sonne, that they are one Bod almighty, fo 3 beleue in the boly Bhoft that he is also with them the same Bod almighty.

And I beleue an holy church, that is, all they that have bene, and that now are, & alwayes to the end of the worlde Chalbe, a people the which Chall endenour them to know &

to keepe the commanudements of God, dreading ouet all thing to offed Bod, and louing and fecking moti to please him. And I beleeue, that all they that have had & yet have, and all they that yet thall have the forefayo vertues, threly franding in the velici of Bod, hoping fledfaltly in his mercyfull doinges, continuing to they, and in periect charitye, wilfully, paciently and gladly fuffering perfecutios, by the example of Christ chieffye and his Apostles, all their haue they names written in the boke of life.

Therfore I beleue, that the gathering together of this The true notes people, liming now here in this life, is the body Church of of the true church Bod, fighting here on earth agaynst the fiend, the prosperi church, ty of the world, and they flelhig lufts, wherfore, feing that all the gathering together of this Church before layd, and enery part therof, neither courteth, nor willeth, nor loueth, nor lekethany thing but to eschew foffece of ibod, & to do his pleating will: meetly, gladly, and wilfully, is all name barr, I fubinit my felfe buto this holy Church of Christ, to be ever buronce sobedient to y ordinatice of it, soffuery member therof, after my knowledge and power by f help ot Bod. Therfore I knowledge now and enermoze that, if Bod will, that with all my hart and with all my might, I willlubmit me onely to the rule and gonernaunce of them, who after my knowledge, I may perceine by the haning and vling of the before layd vertues, to be members of the holy Church. Wherfore these articles of belief and al other (both of the olds law and of the new, which after the com-mannaement of Bod any man ought to belone) I believe verely in my foule, as a finful deadly wretch of my cuming and power, ought to belence praying the Lord God for his holy name, for to encrease my beliefe, and to helpe my onbeliefe.

And for because to the prayling of Bods name, I de= fire about all things to be a faithfull meber of holy church, I make this proteilatio before you all foure that are now here prefent, concring that all men & women that now be ablent, knew the fame : that is, what thing fo euer befoze this time I have layde or done, or what thing here I thail doe or lay, at any time hereafter. I beleene, that all the olde law and the new law genen and ordeined by the coulell of the three persons of the Trinity, were generand witten to the saluation of mankind. And I belove, that these salves ave sufficient for mans faluation. And I beleue every arti= cle of these lawes, to the intent, that these arricles ordened and commaunded of these 3. persons of the most blessed trinity, are to be beleved.

And therfore to y rule a the ordinaunce of these, Bods lawes, meekely, gladly and wilfilly, I fubmit me with all mine hartethat whosoener can or will by authority of gods lawe, or by open reason, tell me that I have erred or nowe erre, or any time hereafter thail erre in any article of beliefe (from which inconvenience Bod keepe me, for hys good= nelle) I lubinit me to be reconciled and to be burum & obe= dient buto those lawes of Bod, and to energarticle of the. For by authority, specially of these lawes, I will, thorow the grace of God, be butied charitably but othese lawes. Peatir, a over this, I beleeve a admit all the fenceces, authorities and realos of the laynes & doctors, according vinto holy scripture, and declaring it truely.

I submit me wishily and meckely to be ener obedient aftermy cuming and power, to all thele laynts and Doc=" tors, as they are obedient in worke and in word to Bod & to his law, and further not (to my knowledge) not for any earthly power, dignitye of state, thosow the helpe of Bod. Butlit I pray you tell me, if after your bidding, I challay my hand vpon the booke, to what entent: to sweare thereby And the Archoy, layo to me, yea, wherefore clas And I faid to him. Syr a book is nothing els but a thing coupled together of diners creatures, and to swere by any creature both Bods law and mans law is agaynuic.

But Syl, this thing I say here to you before these your elerkes, with my foresayd protestation, that bow, where when, and to whom, men are bond to sweare of to obey in any wife after Bods law, and faints, and true Poctours, according buto Gods law : I will thorow Gods grace be ence ready thereto, with all my cunning and power. But I pray you fir for the charitye of Bod, that ye will before \$ I (weare (as I have here rehearled to you) tell me how or whereto, that I final fubinitime; and thew me whereithat be will correct me, and what is the ordinaunce that ye will thus oblige me to fulfill.

CAnd the Arthbilhop layd buto me: I will thought that now thou sweate here to me, that thou shalt forsake al the opinions which the fect of Lollogdes holde, and is flaundered with: so that after this time, neither printipe nor a pertly, thou hold any opinion which I tha' (after thou half fwome) rehearle to thee here . Porthou thalt fauor no ma
