For I purpose with the helpe of Bod (into remission of my timnes, and of my toule curied liming) to hate and to see primity and apertly, to follow these men, teaching and counselling whome so ener that I may for to flee & clepew the way that they have chosen to go in, which will lead them to the world end, (if in convenient time they repenethem not) verely forlaking and renoking opely the daunder that they have pitt, and every day yet put, to This fees Church. For certaying, to open dialphemy and slaunder as they have spoken and done, in their renoking & forfaking of the truth, ought not not may not panily be ame-bed, ducly, whether live, I pray you that you buly not for to move me to follow their me, in renoking and forfaking the trueth, and fothfallnes as they have done, and yet doe: wherein, by open enidence they firre Bod to great waath, and not onely agaynst theuselines, but also agayns all the that sauge them, or consent to them herem, or that communeth with them, except it be to their amendement. For where as these metick were pursued of enemies, now they haue obliged them by othe for to flauder and purfue Chuif in his meinbers. Wherfage (as I truft fledfallly in f god-nes of Bod) the worldly conctonfices, and the fully living and the Hidrig from the truth of these runnagares: (half be to me and to many other men and women, an example & an enidence, to fland more fielly by the truth of Lysif.
For certaque, right many men and women, doe marke

and abhorce the follines and cowardnes of their forelayd buttue men, how that they are our come & stopped with benefices, and withdrawen from the truth of Bods word, forlaking occerty to fuffer therfore bodely perfecution. Hor by this bufaythfull boing and apoltalye of them (specially that are great lettered men) and have knowledged openly the truth: and now, either for pleasure or displeasure of tyrauntes, haue taken bire and tempozall wages to forlane the truth and to hold agayns it, saundering and pursuing them that court to followe Chill in the way of righteoutnes, many men and wome therefore are now moned.
