J John Dideastle denounced, detcc= teo and connicted, or and opon diners arricles fanoring both herefye and erroz, before the reuerend father in Chill amy goo Lord, Thomas by the permillion of Bod, Lord Arcobishop of Caunterbury, and my lawfull and rightfull indge in that behalfe, expiculy graunt and confeile:that as coccrning the cleare and power of the most holy father the Pope of Monic, or his Archbilhops, his Bilhops and hys other prelates, the degrees of the church, and the holy Sa= cramentes of the same, specially of the Sacramentes of the aultar of penamice and other observamices besides of our mother holy Church, as Pilgrimages and pardons: Jakfirme (I fay) befoze the fayo renerend father Archbilhon & els where, that H being entil feduced by divers fedicious preachers, have grievously erred, and heretically perfifted, blasphemoully aunswered, and obstinately rebelled . And therfore I am by the layd reverend father, before the reve-rend fathers in Chaif also, the billiops of London, win= chefter, and Bangoz, lawfully condemned for an hereticke.

Renertheles yet, I now remembring my felfe, and co= ucting by this meane to anoyd that tempozall payn which A am worthy to luffer as an heretithe, at the adignation of my most excellent Christen prince and liege Lord, Bing Henry the 5. now by the grace of Bod most worthy Kyng both of England and of Fraunce: Minding also to preferr the wholesome determination, sentence and doctrine of the holy dinivertall Church of Rome, before the unwhateform opinions of my felie, my teachers, and my followers: I freely, willingly, deliberately, and throughly coffele, grafit, and affirme, that the most holy fathers in Chist, S. Deter the Apolite and his fuccellors bythops of Rome, specially now at this time, my most blessed Lord Pope John, by the permission of God, the criss. Pope of that name, which now holdeth peters feat (and each of them in they? fucceftion) hath full frength and power to be Christes Wicarin earth, and the head of the church militant. And that by the freach of his office (what though he be a great finner, and afoir knowne of Bod to be damined) he hath full authority and power to rule and gouerne, byude and lole, faue and destroy, accure and alloyle, all other Christen men.

And agreeably fill onto this, I confesse, graunt, and affirm all other Archisthops, Bylhops, and Helates in their provinces, Dioces, and Parilles (appoynted by the fayo Pope of Rome, to allifte him in his doinges or bulines) by his Decrees, Canons, or vertue of his office: to have had in times past to have now at this time, and that they ought to have in time to come : authoritye and power to rule and to governe, binde and lode, accurle and alloyle, the subjects or people of they, asoresaid provinces, dioces. & parifyes, and that their faid subjectes of people ought of right in all things to obey them. Furthermore, I confelle, graunt, and affirme, that the fayd ipirituall fathers, as our most holy farher the Pope, Archbishops, Bishops, & Prelates : hane had , have now , and ought to have hereafter, authority and power for the cliate, order and gouernaunce of their lubicites or people, to make lawes, becrees, fla= tutes and conflitutions, yea and to publishe, commaund, and compell their layde subjectes and people, to the orier= nation of them.

Moreoner I confelle, grannt and affirme, that all thefe foreland lawes, occrees, flatures and confitutions made, published and commanned, according to the forme of spi= rituall law, all childen people, and encry man in himself is freaightly bound to obscruc, & meckely to obey according to the divertity of the forelayd powers. As the lawes, sta= tues, canons and conflictations of our most holy father the Pope, incorporated in his Decrees, Decretals, Clemenstuces, Codes, Chartes, Ucceriptes, Sexules, and Extranagants over all the world: and as the pronunciali flatuts of Archbilliopps in their provinces, the Sinodall actes of Bilhops in their dioces, and the commendable rules & cu-Comes of prelates in their colledges, and Curates in their parithes, all Chaiften people are both bound to obferue, & also most meckly to obey. Oner & besides all thys, I John Placeaftle beterly forlaking and renouncing all the afores layd errors and herefies, and all other errors and herefies like buto them, lay my hand here byon this boke or holye Buangely of Bod, & sweare: that I thall neuer moze from henceforth holde these asorelayd hereties, nor yet any other like buto them wittinglye. Acither thall I gene countell, ayde, helpe, nor fauor at any time, to them that thall bolde, teach, affirme, or maintagne the fame, as God fhall belpe me, and these holy Euangelies,

And that I Challfrom henceforth faythfully over and inuiolably oblerue all the holy lawes, fractices, Canons, and conflictions of all the Popes of Lome, Archithops Bilhops, and Prelates, as are conteyned and defermined in their holy Decrees, Decretalles, Ctemenenes, Codes, Chartes, Rescriptes, Sertiles, Summes, papall, Erra-uagantes, statutes provinciall, acces synodali, and other ordinary regules and cultomes collitured by them, or that thall channes hereafter directly to be determined of made. To these and all such other, will I my sette with all power pollibly apply. Belides all this, the penamice whiche it Chall pleale my layd renerend father the Lord Archithop of Caunterbury hereafter to enjoyne me for my finice, 3 will meekely obey and faythfully fulfill. If maily, all my ieducers and falle teachers, and all other oclides, whome I Chall hereafter know suspected of herefye or errors: 3 shall effectually present, or cause to be presented with my laybe reverend father, Lord Archbishop or to them which have his authority, to lone as I can conneniently do it, and fee that they be corrected to my vecermost power.

This adduration never came to the hands of the Lord Cobham, neither was it compiled of them for that purpole, but onely therewith to bleave the eyes of the vulcar= ned multitude for a time . After the whiche like iereh and fubrie practife, was also dentied the recautatio of the Archbilhop Thomas Crammer, to flop for a time the peoples mouthes. which subtiely in like manner was also practifed with the falle recantation of Billion Hoper, and dinces other, as in their places hereafter (Chill granning) thatbe licwed.

And thus muth hitherto concerning the field trouble of fir John Oldcaffle Logde Cobham, with all the circumfances of the true time, place, occasion, causes, and order belonging to the same. Wherm I trust I have infliciently farillico all the parties, requilite to a fayinfull hillory, with out corruption. For the confirmation wheref, to the intent the mind also of the wrangling caviller may be fatilitied, & to flop the mouth of the aductiary (which 3 fee in all plas ces to be ready to barke) I have therfore of purpose ancre ed with all my ground & foundation taken out of the Ar= chines and Regiliers of the Archb. of Caut, Exepist. Thom. Arund.ad Rich Lond. wherby may appeare, the manifester= ros both of Polydorus and of Edward Hall, who being deceined in the right diffinction of the times, alligne this citation and examination of the Lord Cobham, to be after the councell of Collance: when as Thomas Arundell Arch= bilhop of Caunterbury at the councell of Constance was not alive. The copy and testimony of his owne letter, shall declare the fame, written and fent to the bilhop of London in forme as foloweth.

Arthbishop of the Epistle of the Arthbishop of Caunterbury, written to the Bishop of London, whereupon dependeth the grounde and certaynety of this foresayd history of the Lord Cobham, aboue premised.

O the reverend father in Christ and Lord, the Lord Robert by the grace of God Bishop of Hereford, Richard by the permisfion of God bishop of London, health and continuall increase of fincere loue. We have of late received the letters of the reverend father in Christ and Lord, the Lorde Thomas by the grace of God Archb.of Cant.primate of all England, and Legate of the Apostolicke see, vnto our reuerend brother the Lord Richard Bishop of London, health and brotherly loue in the Lord. It was lately concluded before vs in the conuocation of Prelates and Clergve of our prouince of Caunterb. last celebrate in our church of S. Paul, intreating amongest other thinges with the sayd prelates & clergy vpon the vnion and reformation of the Church of England by vs, and the fayd prelates and Clergy: that it was almost impossible to amende the hole of our Lordes coate whiche was without seame, but that first of all certayne nobles of the realme, which are authors, fauourers, protectors, defenders, and receivers of these heretickes called Lollardes, were sharpely rebuked, and if neede were by the censures of the Churche, and the helpe of the secular power, they be reuoked from their errours. And afterward having made diligent inquisition in the conuocation amongest the proctors of the Clergy and others which were there in great number out of euery dioces of our province: It was found out amongelt ham front d be others, that fir Iohn Oldcastle knight, was and is the principall made out of the receiver, fauourer, protector and defender of them: and that specially in the Diocesse of London, Rochester, and Hereforde, he hath sent the sayd Lollardes to preach, not being licenced by Pistry to florish. the ordinaryes and Bishoppes of the Dioces or places, contrary to the provinciall constitutions in that behalfe made, and hath
