amonalt many other thinges be answered plainly, that he would make no other declaration or answere therunto the was contegued in the layd Scedule. Wherupon we fauoring the layd fir John, with benigne & gentle meanes we spane unto him withis manner. Sir John take heed, for if you do not playally auswere to these things, which are obtected agaynit you within a lawful time now grauted you by the Hudges, we may declare you to be an hereticke, but the faid fir John persenered as before, and would make no other answere . Consequently notwithstanding, we toge= ther with our layd felow biethien and others of our coun= lettok adule, and by their counfell declared buto the faid fir John Diocastie, that the sayo holy Church of Rome in this matter following the faying of bleded S. Augustine Acrome, Ambrole and other holy men, bath determined, by which determinations energy catholicke ought to observe. wherupon the faid fir John answered, y he would beleue and observe whatsoever the holy Church determined, and whatfocuer god would be fhould observe and beleue. But that he would in no case affirme that our Lord the Pope, y cardinals, Archbilhops, and Bilhops or other prelates of the church hanc any power to determine any fuch matters. wherunto, we yet fauging him, under hope of better adunement promited the layo lir John: that we would geue him in writing certaine determinatios byon the matter a= torclaid, whereunto he frould more plainly autwere, writte in latin, and for his better buderstanding translated into English: wherupon, we commaunded and harrily defired him that against monday next folowing, he should gene a playne & full answere, the which determinations we cauied to be traffaced the same day & to be deliucted buto bim the londay next folowing. The teno; of which determina= tions here folow in this maner.

The fayth and determination of pholy Churche byon the holy Sacrament of the aultar is this . That after the confectation done in the malle by pricely material bread shall be chaunged into the materiall bodye of Chailt, & the materiall wine into pmateriall blond of Chrift. Therfore after the confectatio there remayneth no more any substace of bread and wine, which was there before. What doe you answere to this article?

Also Hames Cole, & A. See nens our notavies appointed on this behalf. They all and enery one being swoine vpon y holy gospell of god laying their handes vpon the booke that they shoulde gene they? faythfull counsell in, and bpo the maner aforelayde, and in enery such cause and to the whole world. By and by appered fir Robert Borley Knight, Lienetenant of the Tower of London, and brought with him the foresayde Syr I. Dlocaftle ferring him befoze bs . Unto whom we gentive and familiarly rehearled the acces of the day before palled. And as before we tolde him that he both is and was ercomunicate, requiring and intreating him that be would de= fire and receive in due forme the absolution of the Church. Cluto whom the faid Syr John then and there plainly an Iwered, that in this behalfe he would require no absolution at our handes but onely of Bod. Then afterward by gen=

tle and loft meanes we defired and required him to make playne answere unto the articles which were laid against him. And first of al, as conching the Sacrament of the aul= tar. To the which article, belives other thinges he aniwes red and fayorhus: That as Chailt being here in earth had in him both Godhead & manhode. Porwithstanding the Bodhead was covered and invisible under the humanity, the which was manifest and visible in him: to likewise in the lacrament of the aultar there is the very body and very bread, bread which we do fee, the body or Christ hidden under the lame which we do not fee . And playing denyed, that the tayth as touching the faid Sacrament determined by the Romilly church and holy ooctors and lent unto him by us in the layd Schedule, to be the determination of the holy Church. But if it be the determination of the Church he layd that it was done contrary buto the feriptures, after the church was endowed, and that poylon was poured into the Churche and not afore. Also as touching the Sacellment of penance and confession, be playnly fayd and affirmed the and there:that if any man were in any greuous sinne, out of the which he knew not how to rife, it were ex pedient and good for him to go buto fome holy and discreet priest to take counsell of him. But that he should confesse is to be alowed, his suncto any proper Priest, or to any other although he might haue the vie of him, it is not necessary to saluation, for io much as by only contrition fuch finne can be wiped a way, the finner himielte purged. As concerning the worthipping of the croffe, he tayo and affirmed that ponly boby of Chailt which did hange bpon the crotie is to be wozthipped. For to much as that body alone was & is ferotte, which is to be worthipped.

the Jmage of the croffe. De auniwered by expecte wordes that he would only do it that honor that he would make it clean and lay it op late. As touching the power and authority of the keyes, the Archbishops, Bishop, and other piclates, he layde that the Pope is very antichilf, that is the head: the Archbilhops, Bilhops and other prelates to be his members, and the Friers to be his taple. The whiche Pope, Archbishops and bishops a man ought not to obey, but to far forth as they be followers of Christ & of Peter, in their life, maners & connerfation, and that he is the fuccellor of Peter, whiche is best and pures in life & maners, Furthermore, y faid fir John freeding his handes with a loude voyce, layd thus to thole whiche fiwde about hym. These men which indge and would condemne me, wil se= duce you all a themselves, and wil lead you but o hell, ther fore take heed of them. when he had spoken those wordes, we agaptic as oftentimes before with lainentable countes naunce, spake onto the said sir John, exharting him wyth as gentle wordes as we might that he would returne to \$ vnity of the church, to believe & hold that which the church of Kome both believe & hold who expicilly auniwered that he would not beleue or holde otherwise then he had before

declared. Wherefore, we perceiving as it appeared by hym

that we coulde not picuaple; at the last with bitternelle of

hart, we proceeded to the pronouncing of a definitine fen-

tence in this maner.

¶In the name of God Amen: We Thom, by the permission of God Archb and humble minister of the holy Church of Cant.primate of all England, and Legate of the Apostolicke see, in a certayne cause or matter of herely vpon certeine articles, wherupon fir Iohn Oldcastle knight, Lord Cobham, before vs in the last couocation of our Clergy of our prouince of Caunterbury holden in the Church of S.
