John wickliffe, and his 45. Articles was recited, and fentence gene against his memory & bones to be burned. The tenor where is rehearled in the hillory of John wickliffe before valled. fol.449.

Buthe 9. Sellion, The matter & cause of Pope John was again intreated, and commillioners appoynted to en quire pour his caule, and indges for the lame.

In the ro. Sellion, Sulpention was genen out & reade

agaynst the sayd 19ope.

In the 11, and 12. Sellions, Potaries were alligned & Definitive fentence genen agapuft the faid Pope, where al= to was decreed that none of them that contended before for the papacy, thould be cholen pope.

Authers, Sellion was becreed, Quod nullus præfbiter fub pena excommunicationis comunicet populo fub vtraque fee cie panis & vini. This is, that no foicet under payne of excommunication fiall communicate buto the people buder

both kindes of bread and winc. In the 14. Sellion, came in prelignation of pope Bre= gozy the re, which was one of the 3. before mentioned, firis uing for the Papacy, with certaine other Articles concer= ning the election of the Bilhop of Rome, and the ratifica-

Tion of their relighting, which gave over the Papacy.

Then enfuely the 14. Settlon, in the which filence was commanded on all partes under pain of excommunicatio, and the great curle that no perto or persons high or low of what eliate or degree so euer he were , Emperour, Lyng, Cardinall, or other fould diffurbe the layd Sellion with any maner of noise, either by hand, for, or voyce. This be= ing done, the lentence & condemnation against John Bus was read and pulished, whiche after in the story of John Bus, foloweth to be fene more at large.

In the 16. Sellion, Amballadors were alligned by the Counceil to go into Arragon to Benedictus the 13. to en= treat with him for the relignation of his Papacy, as the o=

ther two had done before.

Acem, power was genen to indges, to cite buder pain of deprination, all such as privily departed away from the Councell, in the whiche Sellion also the sentence agayust John Bus was confirmed and ratified.

In the 17. Sellion, the Emperour tooke voon him a courney to the king of Arragon, to entreat with pope Benedicins. An excommunication denounced against at such as Could go about to empeche the Emperours iourney as bout that matter. &c.

Item, pray is and procedions were determined to be made by the Louncell, every Sonday for the fame cause, with an hundred dayes of pardon geven to the that would be present thereat, and that all presats should be present at cucry of their layd Malles and procedions in they? Ponti= ficalibus. Braunting belides to enery Priest that layd one egalic, for the lame a 100. dayes of pardon. And to all other that once a day thould fay one Pater nofter, and one Aue, for the fafety of the Emperour rl. dayes of pardon.

In the 18. Sellion , certaque judges were alligned for the hearing of matters, which the Councell had no leafure

to heare.

It was there also becreed that suche letters and Buls as were waitten in the name of that councell, thould be receiued with no leffe credite and authority, then the Bulles proceeding from the Sea Apoltolicall, and that the fallity= res of the fame (hould incurre no leffe penalty then the fal-fifyers of the other. Legates also and Amballabours were fent into Italy.

In the 19. Sellion which was flame yeare in the mo= neth of September , Jerome of Page who was cited as is before layd, was accused of herely a cast in prison by the sayd councell, a constrayned to absure. The which his abinvation bereafter foloweth to be feene in his history.

Item, it was decreed: Quod non obstantibus saluis codu-Ctibus Imperatoris Regum.&c. possit per iudicem competentem de hæretica prænitate inquiri.&c. That is, notwithstanding y safe conduct genen by the Emperour and kinges. &c. Inquiry may be made agaynst a man for berely by a sufficient indge and procede, to be made according to the law.

The caules of herelies were committed to certain ind=

ges and deputyes.

Item, the Chart called Carolina, and divers other Chartes and conflictations concerning the libertyes of the Church of Rome, being brought forth were approued and confirmed,

In the 20. Section, letters & instrumentes were made and fet byon Church dozes to require and admonify duke Fredericke to restore agayne buto Beorge Bishop of An= firiche, such landes, rentes, and revenues as he deterned & withheld, bider payne of interditement, sufpending and ercommunication.

During the time of this Sellion, the Amballadors returned our of Arragon from the Pope Benedict and were heard with great audience, wheras certayne Articles and conditions betwene the Pope & the councell were brought forth and agreed byon to the number of 12.

In the yeare of our Loid 1416. was the 21. Sellion be= ginning after they maner with a Maffe of the holy ghoft with procedious and such other rites, in the time of which Malle, James Billiop of Londy madea Sermon, taking for his Theame thele wordes. Exprobrauit Deus incredulitatem corum & duritiam: That is, the Lord rebuted they? milbeliefe and hardnes. ac. This termon being ended, Jerome of Prage which had abilired, as is sayd the yeare before, being present thereat, flode up upon a tertaphe bench or fourme. Replying against the foresayd James and bys Sermon, alleadging and preaching biners and fundive thinges, whereupon the Barriarch of Conftantinople, one thop of Loof the commillioners proceeded agaynft him, pronouncing the sentence desimitive, which he had in writing agaynt the layd Jerome, which sentence being red and approved by the councell (the tenoz whereof infueth in his historye) the land Acrome was delinered buto the lecular power, & burneb.

The 22, and 23, Sellions contagne no worthy matter, but oucly the placing of the Ambaliadours of Alphanius B. of Arragon, a graunting them voyces in the Councell.

In the 24. Sellion, citatio was acuen out agaynt Benedict, keeping with Alphonlus, king of Arragon.

The 25. Sellion contemeth nothing but a certayne Comendam genen to the Church of Diemucchiis.

The 26. Sellio, there was nothing els handled, but the oniting and incorporating of the Amballadors of the king of Rauarre into the Councell, and also concerning the derogation of the priority of boyces.

After this followed the 27, and 28. sellions, which were in the yeare 14.17. wherein was intreated the relation and declaratio, concerning the cause betweet Duke Frederick, and the bilhop of Trident, and procelle genen out agaynst the layo Duke, acculing him of lacriledge, and allo excommunicating him, for not obeying the admonitio of the coucell concerning the blurpation and decryning of the city of Tridet and other policitions from Billion George, as is afore specified.

In the 29. and 30. Sellions, Pozoctors and Motaryes were geuen out in the cause agaynst pope Benedict, and order decreed upon his obstinacye, wherein also the withdiawing of the king of Arragon from the same Hope, was

recited and approued by the Councell.

In the 31. Sellion, certagne instrumentes, and speciall letters monitory were directed from the Councell to a certaine Earle of Fraly named Comes virtuum, for laying visolent handes upon Albert, Bilhop of Afce, and for brings ing him to prison, requiring the layd Carle under paine of interdiction, and excommunication to let the layd Bylhop at liberty. Also an other becree was let forth for the restoring agayne the liberties of the Church of Baron.

In the 32, and 33, Schions, the acculation of pope 18e= nedict was renucd, and his obstinacy accused, and witnes brought in , at which thing boing , the Emperour Sigilmund was prefent.

In the 34. Sellion, the cause of the forelayd Pope was heard, and procede geuen out agaynft him.

In the 35. Sellion, the Amballabours of the king of Calle were brought in, and butted to the Councel, and in strumentes thereof made and read. Also that not with stan= ding the other made to the foreland Hope, me might law= fully forlake his obcoience.

In the 36. Sellion, a certagne citation was made and The Pope read against the Pope, conteming his deprination and the curfeth the fentence agaynft him, & instruments made bpon the same. councell. And whereas this 19 ope had thundred out his curies, de= prinations and excommunicatios against them: The layd Sinode did admibilare all his doinges.

The 37. Section did renue agayne the acculation of the forelaid pope, and the lentence definitive against him was publiched.

In the 38. Sellid certaine decrees were made touching the admibilating of the penalties of the Amballadours of king Henry sonne of Alphonsus king of Arragon, Also an other decree was made touching the renocatio of proyees graunted to the Amballadors of the king of Arragon.

Thus Pope Benedice being depoted and excommuni= cated as is aforelayd, in the next Sellions following, they addicted theinfelues to the election of a new Pope, beginning first in the 39. Section to gene out decrees concerning generall Councels, & prouision, for the auopoing of suche Decrees for like schismes hereafter. Decreeing euery p. yeare to have a o paue a generall general couniels.
