¶ The effect in English.

The effect of this Sentence is as much to meane in England as that Pope Clement the vii. with the consent of

(A) The Pope, & with the consent of his other bretherne the Cardinals assembled together in his Consistorie, setting there in the throne of his Justice, calling upon the name (B) of Christ, and having God only before his (C) eyes, doth pronounce, declare, & declare in the cause & causes between his bretherne Catharine Queen of England appealing to the said Papalchancery, & his sonne (D) Iohannes Henr. the eight, King of England, concerning y^e validity & in invalidity of the Matrimonio hec locute contracte between the, and per dependent in the Consistorie court of the said pope Clement, that the said Matrimonio alwaies hath (E) had full & plene title & Canonical, & that the same proceeding, & which shall proceed of the same, shall stand lawfull & legitimate, and that the foresaid Henry King of England, is and shall be holden

(F) By his ownne Caution law, he meaneith, & by the lawe of God.

(G) Here follow may bee good reader howe the Pope may & doth erre by a false Bephet. For where he thought to put the king to f^elence, he lente him silence lighted upon himselfe, & whereby the Pope is uniened himselfe, stand merte in Englad, & God graunt he may to stand for ever Amos.

and obstrict to the Matrimoniall society and cohabitacion with the sayd Lady Catharine his lawfull wife & Quene, to hold and maupreine her with such loue and principe honor, as becometh a louing husbande, and his kingly ho-

nor, as becometh a louing husbande, and his kingly ho-

nor to do.

Also that the sayd Henry King of England, if he shall refuse so to performe and accomplish all and singular the premises, in all effectual manner, to be condemned and compelled hereunto by all remedies of the law, & custoed, according as we do cōdemne, compell and encoise him so to do, providing that al molestations and refusals what soever, made by the sayd King Henry agaist the layde Queen Catharine, upon the invalidity of the sayd Matrimonio, to have bene and to be judged unlawfull and vnuall; and the sayd King shal henceforth for ever to hold his peace, and not to be heard in any Court hereafter (G) to speake touching the invalidity of the sayd matrimony; also as we also do here will and charge him to holde his peace, and do put him to perpetual silence herein: Willing moreover & adiudging the sayd King Henry to be condemned and punitio[n] herefor to doe conuenient hem in the expenses on the sayd Queen Catharines behalfe here in our Court, exposed & employed in traunelling the foſefaid cause, the valuation of which expenses we referre to our selves to be limited and taxed as we shall judge meete hereafter.

Now as you have heard the presumptuous and arrogante Sentence of Pope Clement, wherein he taketh upon him, contrary to the ordinance of God in his Constitutio[n] law (as before is shewed pag. 102.) and contrary to v[er]e 10. deuteridio[n]e, to command and compell the King against his conscience, to recine in Matrimonio his bisches wife: here followeth in like order to be inferred, according to my pacific, an other the wretched, blasphemous, and scandalous Bull of Pope Leo against Martin Luther, with the just Appellation also of the sayd Martin Luther, from the Pope to a general Council, wherein may appear to all men the lying spirit of the pope, both in traching most heretical doctrine, derogating from the bloud of Christ, and also falsely departing & perverting the sound doctrine of Luther, falselie and vniuely charging him with heresy, when he is the greater heretic himselfe. For what hereticke would ever say that the church of Rome was concorde and sanctified by the bloud of Peter, but onely the Pope? & who would cal this heresy, to referre at ones salvation and laueration onely and totally to the bloud of the sonne of God, vntille he were an hereticke of all hereticke himselfe?

After the like dealing we read, 3. Reg. 18. of wicked king Achab, who being onely the disturber of Israel himselfe, crieth out vpon Elias, for troubling Israel. So he intinablewise Pope Leo, with what heape of tragical woes and exclamations doth heare and rage agaynsst true servant of God p[ro]p[ter] Luther, for disturbing p[ro]t[est] church of God, when it is the Pope onely & his fathers house that troubleth, & long hath troubled the true Church of the Lord, as by his doings all the world may see enough & to much. In the meane time read, I beseeche thee, with judgement this impudent & false hauderous Bull of the Pope, with the appiale also of Luther againt from the sayd pope. The copy whereof because they be rare to be gotten, & hath not bene heretore commonly leue, being before omitted to thought to come here to history, as I had it out of certaine Regesters, the maner & tenor wherof is this as followeth,

Leo Episcopus seruus servorum Dei ad perpetuum rei memoriam: Exurge Domine & indica cuiuslibet tuum. Memor eo impiorum corum quae ab infipientibus sunt tota die. Inclina aurem tuam ad precies nostras, quoniam rex rexirent vulpes querentes demoliri venient, cuius tu torcularis lois calcisti & alienus ad patrem, cuius curam, regimē, & administrationem Petrus tanquam Eccl[esi]e, & tuo vicario tuisq; successoribus instaurans, eccl[esi]e commisiſſi, &c.

The sayd sclauderous and barbarous Bull of Pope Leo the x. againt Luther, in English, with the sunswere of Luther ioyned to the same.
