E Dmund by the grace of God,&c.To my welbeloued brethren the Deane and Chapiter of the Cathedrall church of S. Paule in London, and to the other Ministers there and enery of them do fend greeting. And where it is so, that of late I have receyued the fayd foueraigne Lord the kings maiesties letter, of such tenure as is hereunto annexed, and according to my most bounden dutie, am right well willing and defiring, that the faid letters should be in all points duely executed and observed according to the tenure and purport of the same, as apperteineth: these therfore are to require and also straightly to charge you and enery of you on his maiesties behalfe, &c. that you do admonish and commaund or cause to be admonished or commaunded, all and singuler Perfons, Vicars, and Curates of your jurisdiction, to obserue and accomplish the same from time to tyme accordingly: Furthermore requiring and likewise charging you, and euery of you to make certificate herein to me, my Chauncellour or other my officers in this behalfe, with such convenient celeritie as appertaineth both of your procedings in the execution hereof, and also the persons and names of all fuch, as from hencefoorth shall be found negligent in doying their dueties in the premisses or any of them . Forafmuch as we are advertised, that among to other diforders of our lubicces, at this prefent there be divers of our citic of London, and other places within your Dioces which being very negligent and forgetfull of their duetie to almighty Bod, of whom all good things are to be loked for, doe affemble themselves very seldome & sewer tymes then they were heretofoze accustomed, buto commo praier and to the holy Communion, being now a tyme when it were more needefull with hart and mynde to pray to out heavenly father for his and and fuccour: wherofas we be right fory, so we do understand, that through your enil erample and the flackness of your preaching, and instructing our layd people to doc their duties, this offence to God is most generally committed: for where heretofore byon all Principall feaths, and fuch as were called Maius duplex, you

your felfe were wont to execute in person, now since the tying that we by the admife of our whole Parliament have fet a most godly and denout order in our Church of Eng= land and Freland, ye have very feldome of neuer executed byon such or other bais, to the cotempt of our procedings ecuil crample of others: & foralmuch as it is also brought to our knowledge, that omers as well in London as mother places of your Dioces, do frequent and haunt foraine rites of malles, and suche as be not allowed by the o!= ders of our realme, a contemneth and forbeareth to praise and land Bod, and pray buto his mairifie after fuch rites and ceremonics, as in this realine are approued & fer out by our authornie; and further that adultery and fornica= tion is maintained and kept openly and commonly in the land citic of London & other places of your Dioces, where by the weath of god is pronoked against our people: of the which things, you beying heretofoze admonished, yet he= thereo have made no redicile, as to the pattogall office, authoritie, a cure of a bishop doth appertaine: we therefore, to whom the supreme cure and charge of this Church both licke lawes. appertaine, to anoid fro vs the high indignatio of alinightie Bod, by the adule of our most entirely beloned Uncle the L. Protector and the rest of our pring Counsaile, have thought it no leffe then our most bonden dutie, now at this piclent, and efflones peremptorily to admonify, charge, & warne you, that you do most straightly looke vpourthe premilles and fee them to refounce, that there may appeare no negligence on your behalfe, bponfuch pavue as by our lawes Eccleliafticail and temporall, we may inflice beyort you, buto deprination or otherwife, as fhall feme to be for qualitie of poffence reasonable. And to the inteneyou shold the better fee to y reformation of the fayd abutes, we have thought good to gene you thefe Innunctions following.

First, ye shall preach at Paules Cross in London, in Certains privat proper person, the Sonday after the date hereofin, weeks, and in the fame Sermon declare and fer forth the Articles hereunto annexed: and ye shall preach hereafter once e= nery quarter of the pere there, erhotting in your Sermon the people to obedience, prayer, and godly linying: and ye every quarter at thall be prefent at every fermon hereafter made at Paules Paules Croffe. Evolle, if lickenelle or fome other reasonable cause boe not let you.

Secondly, you your felfe in person shall from bence= fourth energy day which hecetofore was accounted in this Church of England, principalifeaft, or Maius duplex, and at all luch tymes as the Bilhops of London your picoc= cellours were wont to celebrate and fing high malle, now celebrate and execute the Communion at the bygh aulture in Paules, for the bettererample of all other, except fiches

nes do let. Thirdly, ye thall your felle according to voice ductie & the office of a bilhop, cal before you all fuch as do not come buto and frequent the Common prayer and fervice in the Church, or do not come onto gods boord, and receive the Communion at the lest once a yearc, or who so euer to frequent or go buto any other rice or levuice, then is appoint ted by our boke, either of Matting, Euenfong, or maffe in any church, Chappell, or other prinate places within your Dioces, and ye chall fee all fuch offenders connented before you and punished according but the Ecclesiasticall lawes, with severe and trait punishment thersore. Lyke= wife ye thall fee one onely order vied in your Diocette ac= colding to our fayd boke and none other.

Fourthly, ye thall both by your felle and all your officers under you, learch out a conuent before you more biligently then beretofore ye have done (as apperraineth to your office) all adulterers, and fee the same punished according to the ecclesiastical lawes, and to the authority ge=

nen you in that behalfe.

we have heard also complaintes, that the Churche of Paules and other Churches of London are of late more neglected, as wel in reparation of the glade, as other builbings and ordinaunces of the fame, then they were heretofore wont, and that divers and many persons in the citie, of malice denyeth the payment of their due tith to their Curates, whereby the Curates are both iniured and made not to well able and in maner discouraged to do they, ducties. The which thyng also our will and commaunde= ment is, ye hall diligently loke buto, and fee redicited as appertaineth.

And foralimuch as al thele complaints be made as most Boner Bishop bone & committed in London, to the intent you may loke of Londo commore earnestly, better and more diligently to the reformation of them, our pleasure is that you that abide and keepe refidence in your house there, as in the citie, sea, and principaliplace of your Dioces, and none other where for a certaine tyme, butill you thalbe otherwise licented by vs.
