Thus the rii. day of February (as I fayd) was beheabed the Lady Jane, and with her alfo the Lord Bifford her bulband, one of the Duke of Mothumberlands formes, two innocets in comparison of them that face byon them. For they did but ignorantly accept that which the others had willingly benifed, and by open popolamanon confented to take from others and gene to them.

Douching the condemnation of this Lady Jane, heere is to be noted, that the Audae Morgan who gave the fentence of condemnation againft bir, hogely after be had conbemned her, fell madde, and in his raning cried our contimually to have the Lady Jane taken away from bym, and

to ended his life,

And not long after the death of the Lady Jane, bypon the exi. of the lame moneth, was Benry Duke of Suffolke her father also beheaded at the Tower Bill, the tin. Day after his condemnation : about which time also were condenned for this conspirace many Gentlemen and Peo-men, whereof some were executed at London, and some in the Countrey. In the number of whome was also Lorde Thomas Bear, beether to the layde Duke, being apple Suffaile beheabenerd not long after in Porth wales, and executed for the fame. Sir Kirbolas Thiogmorton very hardly elca-ped as ye fhall heave (the Lord willing) in another place.

A monition of Boner B.of London to all ministers of his Dioces.

Dmund by the permission of God, Byshop of London, to all Parsons, Vicares, Curates and Ministers of the Church, within the Citie and Dioces of London, fendeth grace, peace, and mercy, in our Lorde euerlasting. For as much as by the order of the Ecclefiafticall lawes and conflitutions of thys Realme, and the lawdable viage 3c custome of the value Catholicke Church, by many hundreth yeares agone, duely and deuoutly observed and kepr, all faithfull people beeing of lawfull age and differeion, are bounde once in the yeare at least (except reasonable cause excuse them) to be confessed to theyr owne proper Curate, and to recease the Sacrament of the aultar, with due preparation and denotion; and for as much also as we be credibly enformed, that fundry euill disposed and vudeuout persons, genen to lenfuall pleasures and carnall appetites, following the lufts of their body, and neglecting viterly the health of their foules, do forbeare to come to confession according to the fayd ylage, and to recease the Sacrament of the aulter accordingly gening therby permicious and cuill example to the yonger fort, to neglect and contemne thefame: we minding the reformation heereof for our owne discharge, and desirous of good order to be kept, and good example to be genen; do will and command you by vertue heereof, that immediately upon the receipt of this our commauudement, yee and enery ech of you within your cure and charge, do yfe all your diligence and dexteritie to declare the fame, straightly charging and commaunding all your parishioners, being of lawfull age and discretion, to come before Easter next comming, to confession, according to the fayd ordinaunce and viage, and with due preparation and denotion to receive the fayd Sacrament of the aulter, and that we do note the names of all fuch as be not confessed vitto you, and do not receive of you the fayd Sacrament, certifying vs or our Chauncellour or Commiffary thereof before the fixt day of Aprill next enfuing the date heereof; fo that we knowing thereby who did not come to confession, and receyuing the Sacrament accordingly, may proceede agaynft them, as beeyng persons culpable, and transgressours of the sayd ecclesialtical lawe and viage: Eurther also certifying vs or our favd Chauncellour or Commissary, before the day aforesayde, whether ye haue your aultars set vp, chalice, booke, vestiments, and all things necessary for Masse, and the administration of sacraments and sacramentals, with procession and all other dinine service prepared and in readines, according to the order of the Catholike Church, and the vertuous and godly example of the Queenes Maiesties : and if ye so haue not, yee then with the Churchwardens cause the same to be prouided for, fignifying by whose faulte and negligence the same want or faulte hath proceeded, and generally of the not comming of your parishioners to Church, vndue walking, talking, or vsing of themfelues there vnreuerently in the tyme of divine feruice, and of all other open faults and mildemeanours, not omitting thus to doo, and certifie as before, as you will answere vpon your perill for the contrarye. The next moneth following, which was the moneth of March, and the 4. day of the land moneth, there was a letter fent from the Queene to Boner Biffiop of London, with certaine Articles alfo annered, to be put in fpeedy execution, conteining as beere followeth.
