Thefe disputations being thus discoursed and ended, which were at Oxforde in the moneth of Appil, as is aforelayd:nowe let vs returns agains to the profecuting of our flory, touching other things likewife y happened in other parties of the realme, in this tunnituous time of Queene Marie, And because thinges that happened in that time, were so many and divers, that it is hard to keepe a perfecte order in reciting them all: to the entent therefore to inferte things leaft out before, or cle to profecute the same more at full, we have thought becre a litle to interrupt the order of time (albeit not muche) returning agains to the moneth of Autic the years before, videlicet. 1553. In the which moneth of July I theweo before howe the Duke of Porthumber= land was apprehended by the Bard, and brought to Lon= don by the Barle of Arundell and other Lordes and Ben= tlemen appoyuted for that purpole on S. James day, be= ing the 25. day of July, and to to the tower, where they re= mained. Their be the names of them which were committed to the Tower with the Duke.

First the Earle of warwike, the Barle of Buntington, Lord Ambiole, and Lord Henry Dudley, Lord Hastings, who was delinered againe y fame night, sie John Bates, sie Henry Bates, sie Andrew Dudley, sie Thom, Palmer, and D. Sandes Chancelour of Cambridge. the Tower with

The 26. day the Lorde Marques of Northampton, the B.of London, Load Robert Dubly, and fir Richard Cozbet were brought and committed to the Wower,

The 27. day the Lorde chie.e Justice of Englande, and the Lord Moun acute chiefe Juffice of the common place, were committed to the Tomer.

Appointhe Friday being the 28. of Julye, the Duke of Suffolke, and Sir John Checke were committed to the Tower.

The 30. of Inlye, the Lorde Rullell was committed to the Sheriffe of Londons cuftodie,

The zi. day the Carle of Rutlande was committed to the Fleete.

Uppon the monday the last of July, the Duke of Suffolke was delinered out of the Tower againe.

Upon thursday the 3. of August, the Queenc entred into the entire of London at Alg. te, & so to the Tower, where thee remained feuen daics, and then remoued to Richmond

Appon friday the fourth day, doct. Day was delivered out of the fleete.

Upon facerday the 5. day, the Lorde Feries was com= mitted to the tower, and the same daye D. Boner was de= livered out of the Marthalley. The lame day at nyght D. Cockes was committed to the Marthailey, and one M. Edward Underhill to Rewgate. Allo the fame day doctor Tontial and Ste. Bardiner were delinered out of the Tower, and Bardiner received into the Quenes privite coun= faile, and made Lord Chanceloz.

Uppon Sunday the 7. day, Denry Dudley captaine of the Barde at Buynes, whych before had beene fente to the French king by his cofin the Duke of Mothumberlande, after the dispatch of his amballage with the French kinge returned to Buines, & so was taken, and this day brought to the Tower.

Uppon mondage the leuenth day of August, Dirige in Latine was songe wythin the Tower, by all the Kynges Chappel, and the billion of winchefter was chief minifier, wherar was present the Queene, and the most parte of the

Elppon Auclday the biff. day of August, the kings body was brought to wellminder, and there buryed, where D. Day Bilhop of Chichefter preached. The fame daye a Malle of Requiem was longe within the tower, by the By= thop of winchester, who had on his Miter, & did althings as in times pall was done, at whyche Malle the Queene

Tipon thurlday the Duke of Mosthfolke came foosth of the Tower, with whom the Duches of Somerlet was also delinered this thurlday

Appon londay the 11. of August, Doctor Bourne preas ched at paules Croffe, of the whych fermone reade befoze, pag. 1339.

In the weeke following, commaundement was geuen throughout the citie, that no prentiles thould come to the fermon, not weare any knife of dagger.

Uppon the wednelday, being the rvi. daye of August. M. Bradford, M. Beacon, and M. Meron, were committed to the Tower: with whom also M. Sampson shoulde have bene committed, and was fought for the fame time in M. Ellinges houle in fleerestreere (where M. Bradforde was taken) and because he was not founde, the Bylliop of winchester fumed like a prelate with the messenger,

Upon the Fridaye being the 18.0f August, the Duke of Morthumberland, the marques of Morthampton, and the Barle of warwicke were arrayned at wellminfter, and there y same day condemned, the Duke of Rozthsolke that day being the high Judge.

Apon laterday the 19.0f August, sir Andzew Dudley fir John Bates, fir Denryc Bates, and fir Thomas 19al mer were araigned at wellminfler, & conbemned the lame day, the L. Marques of wincheffer being hie Judge.

Tipo which day, a letter was fent buto fir Benry Tirrel, Anthony Browne, and Edmonde Browne Elquiers, praying them to committe to warde all fuche as shall contenine the Queenes order of religion, or thall keepe them felues from church, there to remaine butill they be conformable, and to fignific their names to the counfaile.

Upon Sonday the 20.0f August, Doctour wation the D.Wation Bythoppe of winchefters Chaplaine Preached at Paules Preached at Croffe, at whose Sermone man professes the Paules Croffe, at whose Sermone was presente the Marques of Winchester, the Earle of Bedford, the Earle of Penbroke, the Lord Rich, and two hundreth of the Barde with their Balbardes, left the people would have made any flurre againft the Breacher

Appon Monday the 21.0fAugust, the Duke of Roja thumberlande, the Marques of Morthampton, Syl An= brewe Dudley, Syr John Bates, and Syr Thomas Palmer hearde a Malle wythin the Tower, and after Malle they all fine receaued the Sacramente in one kinde onely, as in the Popilhe time was bled. Tippon the Tuelday, being the 22. of August, the Duke of Morthumberlande, Syp John Gates, and Syp Thomas Palmer, were beheaded at the Tower bill, as before is fayd, pag. 1338. The lame day certains noble personnages at the Tower bills. heard Malle wythin the Dower, and likewife after malle, er hill, receased the Sacrament in one kinde.

Toppon Sonday the 27. day of August, Doctour Ched= ley Preached at Paules Crolle, and the same daye the Bythop of Canterbury, Syr Thomas Smith, and the deane

of Paules were cited to appeare the weeke following beforethe Queenes Commillioners, in the Billyops Confis fforie within Paules.

In this meane time it was noyled abroade by running rumours fallely and craftely deniled, eyther to fablish the crediter the Malle, orels to brynge Thomas Cranmer Archbishop of Canterbury out of credite, that he to currys fauour with Queene Wary, thould promife to fay Dirige Malle after the old custome, for king Edward, and that he had already layd Malle at Caunterburie, ec. wherefore to hoppe the nople and flaunder of those rumours, the sayde Thomas Archb. of Caunter, the 7. day of September fette forth a letter, which was also printed, in purgation of him felie, the copie of which letter heere ensueth.

A purgation of Thomas, Archbishoppe of Caunterburie, against certaine sclaunders fallely raised upon him.

As the deuill, Christes auncient aduersarie, is a lier and the father of lies, even so hath he stirred up his servaunts and members, to perfecure Christ and his true worde and religion with lying: which hee ceasseth not to doe most earnestly at this present Canterbury time. And to bringe the same more easily e to passe, some have abused the name of mee Thomas Ar. hb of Canterburie, bruting abroad that I have fet vp the Masse again at Canterburie, & that I offred to say Masse at the buriall of our late soueraign prince K.Ed.6.& that I offred also to say Masse before the Queenes highnesse and at Paules Churche, and I wot not where. And although I have bene well exercised these xx yeres to suffer and beare euill reports and lyes, and haue not bene much greued thereat, but have borne all things quietly, yet when vntrue reports & lyes turne to the hinderance of Gods truth, they are in no wife to be fuffered. Wherefore these bee to fignifie vnto the world, that it was not I that dyd fet up the Maffe at Caunterbury, but it was a falle flatteryng, lying, and diffem-
