A letter sent to his frende,

"De creemall Bod keepe you in his feare. I have bearry commendations buto you and your bufbande, befee= ching almighty Bod to preferue you in well doing, and in perfecte knowledge of his Chiffe, that yee may be founde faultles in the day of the Loide. I have heard fage, that my frende is genen ouer to vanitient breaketh my hearte, not onely to heare that he so doeth, but also teacheth other, that it is buhurtful to goe to all abhominations, whych nowe fland in the Mools temples : neuerthelelle deare frende, be ye not mooned to follow finners : for they have no inheritance with Bod and Chrifte. But loke that by going into the Avoil temple, ye defile not the temple of Bod: for light hath no felowly ip iv darkenede. But loke what the Loid hath commaunded, that doc. For if not going to Churche were without perfecution, they would not learne you that iction. Butalithing that is sweete to the flell, is allowed of the fielily. The Lord final reward enery man according to his workes, and he that leadeth into captinitie, fhall go into captinitie, and bee that by the fielhly man is led in the field, (hall of the field reads corruption. The Lorde Jelu gene thee his holy spirite. Amen.

I have fent thee an Epille in metre, whiche is not to

be laid up in thy cofer, but in thy heart.

Seeke peace and entue it. Heare Bod love Bod with all thy beart, with all thy foule, and with all thy frength. Thy frend and al mens in Chill Jelus, Rob, Smith. Scribled in much half from M.the 12. of May.

Robert Smith to all faithfull servants of Christ. exhorting them to be strong under persecution.

Content thy felfe with pacience. With Christ to beare the crosse of paine: Which can and will thee recompence, A thousande folde with loyes againe. Let nothing cause thy heart to quaile, Lanch out thy boate, hale up thy faile. Put from the shore: And be thou fure thou shalt attaine,

Vnto the port that shall remaine. For euermore.

The burning of Steuen Harwood, and Thomas Fust, martyred for the testimonie of the Gospel.

A Bout this time died alfo (by cruell fire) thefe two mar-tyls of Bod, y is to fave, Steuen Barwode, at Stratford, and Thomas fult, at ware. which both two, as they were about one time burned with the fore metioned 180= bert Smith and Beorge Tankerfield, although in fundry places: so were they also cramined and openly codemned togethers with them. Their processe because it was joyned all in one with the processe of Robert Smith & other of the laid company about mentioned, I thought it super= fluous againe to repeate the fame: faue that of Thomas Full this is to be added, that where as he in his last appering the 12.0f July, was moved by the Bylhop to revoke his opinion, thus he answered: Ro (laid he) my Lorde, for there is no truth commeth out of your mouth, but all lyes. Veccondemne men, and will not heave the truthe, where can yefinde any announting of greating in Gods booke? I theake nothing but the truthe, and I am certaine that it is the truthe that I speake. This answere of hym onely I finde noted by the Begister: although howe senderly these Registrers have dealt in vetering such matters, that is, in omitting those thinges which moste woozthy were to be knower, by their doings it is eafie to be feene. But to be floor, after their antweres made, both he & Thomas fuff were for their faithfull perseuerance condemned together by the Billiop in his accustomed pitie, as heretikes to be burned, and fo (as before ye have heard) finished they their martyrdom, the one at Stratford, and the other at ware, in the moneth of August and yere abouclayd.

If the fame companie of these r. aboue recorded, whych were fent by to Bythop Boner, by fir Richolas Bare and other Commissioners, in the companie of George Tankersielde and Roberte Smith, was also willyam Hayle of Thouse in the Countie of Eller, who lykewise being examined with the rest, the 12, day of July, received with them also the sentence of codemnation. ting buto the Bilhop of London, and so was he definered Hailes wordes to the Sheriffes as an heretique to be burned, who fente him to Barnet, where, about the latter ende of August, bec moste constantly scaled by his faith with the consuming of his bodge by cruell fire, yeelding hys soule but o the Loide Iclus his onely and moft fure redeemer.

George King, Thomas Leyes, John VVade. sickened in prisone, and were buried in the fieldes.

Y te hearde before of ten fundry personnes sent oute of Rewgate by Maifter Bare and other Commillioners, to be examined of Boner Bilhoppe of London. Of whome fire already have bene executed in scuerall places, as hathe beene thewed: whose names were Elizabeth warne, Beorge Tankerfielde, Kobert Smith, Steuer Barwoode, Thomas Juli, and william Haile. Other three, to witte, Beorge King, Thomas Leyes, and John wave lickening in Lollardes Tower, were so weake that they were remooned into fundin houses wythin the Citie of London, and there departed, and cast out into p fieldes. and there burged by nighte of the faithfull beethien, when none in the day durite doe it, propter metum Iudzorum. The Lagthe of Lagthforde, the Daughter in lawe to John mong the Mar-Marte and Elizabeth warne Marrys, but because five tyrs of the next was reprieued to a longer day, ber florie and Warry dom yeare. we will deferre till the moneth of Januarie the nert years following.

Helike catholike charitie was also thewed byon wil-The line cargoine challer in the Countie of Elex Carpenter, who was brought to Newgate the firste day of A= prill 1555, by John Wotham Conflable of Wautdon in Eller. The first and principall promoter of hym was the Loide Riche, who fent him first to pillone. An other great doer against him also seemeth to be fir Richard Southwell Unighte, by a letter wrytten by him to Boner, as by the copic hecreof appeareth.

Pleaseth it your Lordship to understand, that the Lord Richdid about seuen or eight weekes past, send vppe vnto the Counfaile, one Wil. Andrew of Thorpe within the Countie of Essex, an arrogant heretike. Their pleasure was to commaund me to commit him vnto Newgate where he remaineth, and as I am infourmed, hathe infected a noumber in the prisone with hys heresie. Your Lordshippe shall doe verye well (if it please you) to conuent him before you, and to take order with him, as his case doth require. I knowe the Counsaile meant to haue wrytte heerein
