The william Andrewe being twife broughte before Boner to cramination, there manfully flode in the Defence of hys Religion. At length through fraite handlynge in the Pailon of Acwgate, there be loft his life, which cls bys aductionies woulde have taken away by fire: and fo after the popily manner be was call out into the fielde, and by night was printly buried by the handes of good men and faithfull bzethzen.

Aiffer Foffer Justice, dwelling at Cobdock in the Countie of Suffolke, and a little from Iplwiche, being in continuall hatred against the truthe and the professours of the same, did not onely not ecase day not nighte to studie howe to bring those in thiall and captimity, that were honest and godly inclined to religion, but also what soener they were that once came in hys cla= wes, they easily escaped not without clogge of confcience, or cis folic of lifetto greedy was he of bloude. Among many whom he had troubled, there was one Samuel in king Edwardes dages, a very godly and righte faithfull picas cher of Gods wooder, who for his valiance and constance behautour in his fermons, feemeth worthy of high admiration. De was minifer at Barfolde in Suffolke, where he taught faithfully & fruitfully that flocke which the Lord had committed to bys charge, to long as the time woulde fuffer hym to doe hys ductic.

At the lafte being remooned from the Ministerie, and put from bys Benefice (as manye other good Paffoures were belide) when hee coulde not anoide the raging biolence of the time, yet woulde he not gene oner his care that be had for hys flocke, but woulde teache them privilye and by ficalth, when he coulde not openly be fuffered fo to doc. At what time order was taken by the Queene, to be publifted by the Commissioners, that all priestes whiche had

married in kinge Edwardes dayes, putting they, wines from them, should be compelled to returne againe to they? lobert Sad chaftirie and finale life. This Decree woulde not Samuel well Sande buto, for that hee knewe it to be manifellly wicked voulde not e abhominable, but betermining with himfelfe that Bods lawes were not to be bloken for mannes traditions, kept hys wife ftill at Aplwiche, and gaue his diligence in the meane time to the instructing of other whythe were about bun, as occation ferued. At latte mailter Folter having in= swyfe. telligence becreof, beinge a greate doer in those quarters, forchacked no time nor biligence, but eftlones lendeth out his cipialles abroade, laying hard waite for Samuel, that if he came home to his wife at anye time, they myghte ap=

piedend him, and carie him to pisson.
In conclusion, when suche as houlde betraye hym, cspied him at home with his wife, they dringing worde to the officer, came immediately socking about hys house, and before it with a great companie, and fo tooke hym in the nyght leafon, because they durite not doe it in the daye time, for feare of trouble and tumult, althoughe good Samuell did nothing withfland them at all, but mekely yeels ded himleife into their clouches of his owne accord. When they had thus caughte bym, they put bym into Iploite Rert Sa Baile, where be palled his time meekely among his godly mill put brethren, fo long as hee was permitted to continue there. Bowbeit not long after, being taken from thence, be was carryed (through malice of the wicked lotte) to Rotwiche, where the layde bilhop Doctour Bopton, (whether be or Doctour Dunnings bis Chauncelloure) full like onmercifull pelates exercifed greate crueltie againfte bym, as in deede they were men in that time of perfecution, as had not their matches for firaitnes and cruell tormenting the bodies of the Saintes among all the rell belide, and ipeci= ally through the procuring of Dunnings. For althoughe the other were farpe enough in their generatio: yet could they be latilited with impallonment and death, and would goe no further. Reyther did I ener yet heare of anye bes fides these, which so favre exceeded all bounds of pitte and compation in touncuting their poze biethien as this Bis thoppe did: in luche forte that many of them hee peruerted and broughte quite from the truthe, and some from they? wittes allo.

The B.therefore, or els his Chancellor, thinking that he mighte as cafily prevaile with Samuel, as he had bone wother before, kept him in a very ftrafte prilon at his firft comming, where he was chained boice byzight to a greate
