¶ Alexander Gouche, Martyr.

T which tyme Alexander Bouch also was examined, A which tyme Auctanore would and and whole cra-

mination here after followeth.

This Alcrander Bouch was examined chiefly of the Sacrament & other ceremonies of the popily church. And as for that his beliefe was, that Chilf was alcended into headen, and there remayneth, & that the Sacrament was the remembraunce of his death and pallion, and for refufing the Malle, and the Pope to be supreme hed of Christs Church, for these causes was he condemned, & died with Alice Dipuer at Iplwich, the 4. of Rouember which was the Monday after All Saintes, 1568, D. Myles, Spenfer being Chancelloz, they both endying their lynes with earnell geale, nothing fearying to speake their conscience whe

they were commaunded to the contrary.

Thefe two goody personnes beyng come to the place where the stake was let by 7. of the clocke in the morning, notwithstanding they came the selfe same morning from Melton Gasie, which is vi.myles from Iplwich, beyng in their players, and finging of Plalmes both of them tont their players, and ingray of plannes out or them te-gether. Die Benry Dowell then beying Shiriffe, was be-ry much offended with them, and wylled the Bailiffes of Infinith to bidde them make an ende of their Players, they kneelyng voon a brome fagor, one of the Bailiffes, whole name was Richard Smart, commanned them to make an ende, laying : Dn, on, haue done, haue done : make an ende, nayle them to the flake, yet they continued

Then lie Beney lent one of his men, whole name is

Bieb. Loue, that they should make an end.

When Bouch frod by, and layo buto the Shiriffe: 3 may you so. Shirife let vs pray a little while, for we have but a lutle tyme to lync here.

Then laid the Bailile: Come of, have them to the fire. Then the layd Bouch and Alice Diner layde: why M. Shiriffe, and M. Bayliffe, wyll you not luffer be to

Away, laid fir Denry, to the stake with them.

A Lthough our hillory hasteth apace (the Lord be pray - The Mar-led) to the happy death of Ducenc Mary, yet the died tyrdome of not fo lone, but some there were burned before, and moe Chould have bene burnt some after them, if Bods pronision had not prevented her with death. In the number of them which luffred the fame month when Queene Mary died, were three that were burned at Bury, whole names were thefe:

Phillip Humfrey. Iohn Dauid. Iohn Dauid. Henry Dauid, his brother.
